

MARSHALL FIELD 3d OPENS WILL TEST W. RUCK

Captain Seeks Control of \$125,000,000.

FUND TIED UP FOR YEARS

Suit in Superior Court of Illinois Friendly, but to Be Argued to End.

CHICAGO, May 13.—(Special.)—Captain Marshall Field this week started an attack on the \$125,000,000 will of his grandfather, Marshall Field.

During the life time far of the residuary trust, no money in the way of income has ever been allowed to escape, Marshall Field, now 76 years old, has never received from this residuary estate any income.

When his grandfather determined to make some testamentary disposition of his property, it is presumed that he knew the laws of Illinois. He must have known if there were any provisions in his will which would tie up property.

Legislation is Quoted. Mr. Stanchfield referred here to legislation following close upon the passing of the act prohibiting the very kind of tying up of large estates which his "extraordinary scheme" provided for.

Attorney Stanchfield intimated that the reason why Marshall Field 3d was favored with the largest residuary bequest was because of the merchant's personal liking for the name Marshall.

This question is put to attack the claim of Henry Anthony Marshall, son of the late Marshall Field, who was the executor of the will.

Bond Issue of \$125,000 Is Voted at The Dulles.

THE DULLES, Or., May 13.—(Special.)—The Dulles city civic auditorium at a cost of \$125,000, was decided yesterday, when citizens went to the polls and gave the project a majority of 147 votes.

General obligation bonds to the extent of \$250,000 also were voted. The bonds carried by a majority of 287.

While considerable opposition to the auditorium bond issue developed in the earlier part of the year, the proposition to give music, literature and art in this city, carried the project over by a safe margin.
