

SCHOOL TAX FOR MARION CONVERTED

Taxpayers' Secretary Not to Stand With League.

SALEM, Or., May 11.—(Special.)—Isadore Greenbaum, secretary of the Marion County Taxpayers' league, which for several weeks has been making a spirited fight against the passage of all measures carrying financial obligations to the higher educational institutions as far as the millage tax for the higher educational institutions is concerned and in a public statement said he would support the measure as the polls.

UNIVERSITY IS VISITED

Need of Higher Educational Institutions for Funds Declared Evident—Support Pledged.

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MORE MONEY NEEDED

"You may say that I will not be bound by the resolutions adopted by the Marion County Taxpayers' league and that I shall support the higher educational institutions of Oregon with my vote and my pocket on May 21, 1920. When I visited the University of Oregon yesterday, I became convinced that the buildings were inadequate, that new equipment was needed and that more money must be made available for the support of our competent teaching staff. The class rooms are badly overcrowded and something must be done immediately to relieve these conditions. Oregon cannot afford to retard the progress of these institutions at this time, and regardless of any action that has or may be taken by the Marion County Taxpayers' league, I shall vote for the millage measure for the support and maintenance of the higher institutions of learning on May 21."

MIND NOT MADE UP

"I intend to make thorough investigation of this proposed tax," said Mr. Greenbaum, "and should I find that the levy is necessary in preserving the common schools, I will not vote against it. At present, however, I am not in a position to pass on the merits of this measure."

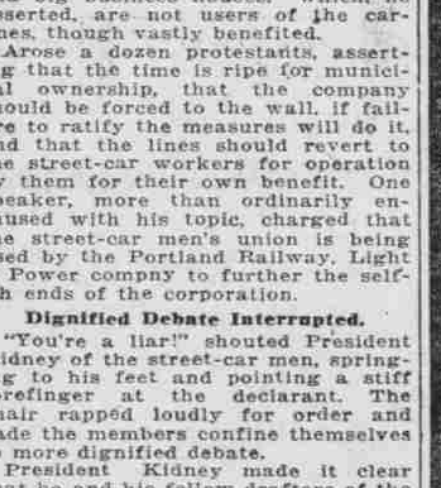
