

HOOPER AND GIVEN LEAGUE CANDIDATES

C. G. Murphy and O. C. Leiter Issue Statement.

VIEWERS ARE INTERPRETED

Leaders of Oregon Club Urge Voters to Select Delegates for Treaty Reservations.

Chester G. Murphy and O. C. Leiter, chairman and secretary of the Oregon Hooper club, issued a statement yesterday to Oregon supporters of Mr. Hoover's attitude toward Friday's primaries.

The statement is as follows: "To the Oregon supporters of Herbert Hoover:

"Mr. Hoover in his wife of last week to us withdrawing from the Oregon primaries requested us to obtain our activities on his behalf and to obtain the vote of the people of the state for only one delegate to the national convention as have committed themselves in favor of the league of nations with senate reservations, and as will favor at Chicago the adoption of a plank in the republican platform urging the speedy ratification of the treaty with such reservations.

"He asks his supporters to keep to the forefront their purpose of right alignment of the party on the many issues before us and use their utmost influence that the republican platform shall endorse the prompt ratification of the treaty and approve the reservations.

"Hoover for Reservations.

"Mr. Hoover is ardently for the league of nations with proper reservations and is against any 'no league' candidate. As this issue is clearly before the Oregon voters, he unhesitatingly withdrew from the Oregon primaries to avoid a destructive split in the vote which would result in the 'clouding' of the voters' will. It is to us much more important that the clubs that have been formed on the issue in Oregon shall devote themselves energetically to every means of obtaining expression from the representatives of that state, regardless of candidates, for the firm adherence of the republican party to the league of nations with the majority of the republican senators, instead of expansion and effort to advance my name.

"And in his wife of withdrawal from the Oregon primaries he says further the president has declared that the democratic party must demand the acceptance of the league in full as presented by him to the senate. Senator Johnson demands that the republican party oppose the league altogether. Two more destructive attitudes toward a great issue could not be found.

"An emergency is created by this alliance of the great majority of our people will be thwarted by either of these extremes. This majority is fixed in its support of the league of nations, both for our own protection and in the interests of the welfare of the world. We must not allow an infringement of our constitution and our traditions.

"The attitude of the president and his supporters and of Senator Johnson and his supporters has brought about a situation at an immeasurable moral and economic cost to our country and to the world. The republican party, however, is to the will of the people and is not to forfeit the certainty of leadership in the next four years. It must support the league of nations with reservations. It must not fall into the trap that the president and Senator Johnson are seeking to into."

"Candidates Are Sounder.

"As the slogans of the candidates for delegates to the national convention, as printed on the ballot, are for the most part silent in regard to the position taken by each delegate on this important issue of the league of nations with senate reservations, we have addressed to each delegate an inquiry as to his position.

"The replies from delegates, we are pleased to announce, show a unanimous position in favor of the league with senate reservations, and for the guidance of the delegates of Oregon Hoover supporters we make public the following list of said delegates who are in favor of the league of nations with reservations and who favor the adoption of a plank in the republican platform urging the speedy ratification of the treaty with such reservations.

"This list is as follows: "Delegates-at-large (four to be elected)—Charles H. Carey, Multnomah county; M. C. Maria, Multnomah county; Conrad P. Olson, Multnomah county; John K. Nislock, Multnomah county; W. E. McCann, Multnomah county; W. H. Brooks, Multnomah county; and M. Z. Donnell, Wake county.

"Second congressional district (two to be elected)—W. H. Brooks, Multnomah county, and M. Z. Donnell, Wake county.

"Third congressional district (two to be elected)—David M. Dunn, Mrs. Mrs. Northrup, and Dow V. Walker, Multnomah county.

"Hoover Supporters Advised.

"We, therefore, urge the supporters of Herbert Hoover in the forthcoming republican primaries to cast their votes for such of these declared candidates as they may prefer.

"As to your choice among the candidates for president as listed on the Oregon primary ballot we have no recommendation to make other than to urge you to vote your choice for the candidate whom you think has the better chance of defeating the 'no league' candidate of Hiram Johnson notwithstanding the fact that the name of Mr. Hoover's name must still appear on the ballot.
