

REFORMED REGIME DEMANDED BY VILLA Personal Safety Guarantee Held Minor Detail.

ENVOYS SENT TO REBELS Outlaw Not to Disband Forces Until Changes in Government Are in Force.

IN CAMP WITH GENERAL VILLA, Benito Huerta, May 19—(Via El Paso, Texas, May 20.)—(By the Associated Press.)—Francisco Villa will not be satisfied with mere guarantee of personal safety from the new revolution in Mexico, he told the Associated Press in an exclusive interview at his camp in the mountains here today.

Villa will demand guarantees concerning how the government is to be organized, and before returns to private life must see the guarantee in actual operation, he said. This means Villa's force of men will not be disbanded immediately, but kept ready for action.

Envoys sent to Chihuahua City from here tonight, headed by Alfonso Gomez, to confer with General P. Elias Calles, minister of war for the revolutionists. Calles was reported as intending to confer personally with Villa here.

Villa declared the new government, to be satisfactory to him, must not include any of the politicians, with perhaps a few exceptions, who have had part in ruling Mexico under Carranza. He said that if a government satisfactory to him were set up he would turn over to the republic vast amounts of his own money.

The present revolution came about over the same causes for which I went to war against Carranza four years ago, Villa said, and the same causes existed then, and I pointed out the insincerity and trickery of Carranza.

Attitude of U. S. Interests. "What the attitude of the United States will be interests me most. The president of the United States, Woodrow Wilson, in what seemed defiance of promises made by American agents, now Carranza individually or collectively I have no ill-feeling, but there is bitterness toward your politicians. In the early days of the revolution I showed my friendliness. I gathered some Americans together, arranged a train for them and saw they were escorted to their own country, in safety. Then when I was forced to send my own wife as a fugitive to the United States for her safety the rings from her fingers and the earrings from her ears were stripped from her without consideration."

Villa declared he had not harmed an American or other foreigner for many months.

SEATTLE PURCHASE OF CARLINE PROBED Mayor Caldwell Takes Step Promised in Campaign.

MILLIONS DECLARED LOST Corporation Council Is Asked as to Possible Procedure Against ex-Owner of System.

SEATTLE, Wash., May 20.—(Special.)—Mayor Caldwell this morning declared that he believes the city was "buncoed" in its purchase of the street railway lines of the Puget Sound Traction, Light & Power company last year for \$15,000,000, and took the first step in the investigation of the transaction which he promised in his campaign speeches little more than two months ago.

The step was in the form of a communication to Walter F. Meier, corporation counsel, asking for a written opinion as to whether the city of Seattle has any ground for an action against the former owner of the street railway lines to recover damages for misrepresentation or to void the transaction.

He said that since taking office of mayor he had endeavored to obtain a few facts relating to the transaction with the idea that the city might obtain some relief from its call in the event it can be shown that it paid several millions of dollars more than the property was worth.
