Good Reasons for Supporting Him

- 1—One dollar out of every \$3 of state taxes is paid by Multnomah County. Select Mr. Schulderman of Multnomah so this county will have a direct voice in handling the state money.
- 2—The Secretary of State is a member of the State Board of Control. If Mr. Schulderman is elected there is no danger of it being a one-man board.

- C—Notwithstanding that extravagance has run riot throughout the nation, adding heavily to the high cost of living, Mr. Schulderman has held down the operating costs of his department and increased its revenues 100 per cent in 1919 over 1918.
- D—He has independent judgment and initiative; he knows the state and its institutions.
