

\$31,196 COLLECTED IN TRAFFIC FINES

Police Promise to Do Even Better in Future.

ACCIDENTS GROW FEWER

Annual Report Says Trouble in Nearly Every Instance Due to Violation of Law.

With a total of nearly 6000 arrests by speed cops of the traffic bureau for traffic violations during the period from January 1, 1919, to April 1 of the present year and more than \$30,000 in fines levied...

"My study of traffic accidents in Portland and other cities has convinced me that the heavy accident toll in killed and injured occurs when there is a lax enforcement of the traffic laws," Lieutenant Ervin said yesterday.

Accidents Decrease One-Half

"During the past few months the vigorous work of my officers has succeeded in cutting accidents down in Portland nearly one-half. The result has been that I have instructed my officers to a more vigorous campaign of traffic enforcement with the object of making a fatal accident in Portland a rarity."

Accidents Due to Violation of Law

Lieutenant Ervin declared that if each driver in the city complied at all times with the traffic laws there would be little sacrifice of the lives of a serious character.

LABOR SCARCE FOR ROADS

HIGHWAY WORK NOT TO BE RUSHED THIS YEAR.

Commissioner Booth Says Depressed Bond Market Also Factor in Causing Retrenchment.

EUGENE, Or., May 28.—(Special).—Highway work in the state will not be rushed this year because of the scarcity of labor, the depressed bond market and other reasons, said R. A. Booth, state highway commissioner, yesterday.

"This will necessitate the selling of a number of bonds, but it is not likely that any new work that involves bond sales will be undertaken except in what might be considered emergency cases, or in connecting pieces of road already finished. For instance, there is but ten miles remaining to be paved between Portland and Salem. These gaps should be closed. There also are some stretches in Washington and Yamhill counties where there should be some additional paving, because the country there is densely populated and there is a great need for some filling in on the short stretches."

Mr. Booth said the next meeting of the commission will be held June 1 and it is probable that at that time the general policy will be decided upon for the season's work.
