Lieutenant Ervin declared that it each driver in the city complied at all times with the traffic laws there would be little excuse for any accidents of a serious character.
"A study of accidents," he declared, "shows that in nearly every instance there is some violation of the traffic laws which is directly or indirectly responsible for the trouble."

In a report compiled yesterday Lieutenant Ervin showed that the speed officers of the traffic bureau

had made a total of 5879 arrests during the period from January 1, 1919, to April 1, 1929, and fines levied as a result of those arrests aggregated a total of \$31,196. This the lieutenant declared to be nearly a third of the fines levied as a result of arrests made by the entire police department. The report states that during that period Motorcycle Patrolman Kelly made the individual record with a to-tal of 776 arrests and fines aggregating \$3937.

Patrolman Rippen comes second with 761 arrests and \$3797 in fines and Patrolman Anderson third with 687 arrests and \$3732 in fines. Arrests Made by Several.

HIGHWAY WORK NOT TO BE RUSHED THIS YEAR.

Commissioner Booth Says Depressed

EUGENE, Or., May 28.—(Special.)—
Highway work in the state will not be rushed this year because of the scarcity of labor, the depressed bond market and other reasons, said R. A. Booth, state highway commissioner, yesterday.
