PROGRESSIVE LABOR CHIEFS WANT PARTY

Federation to Open Annual Meeting Today.

COAST LEADERS ACTIVE

Conservatives Express Belief Plan "Will Not Get Far" and Gompers Will Be Upheld.

MONTREAL, June 6.—Efforts will be made to have the American Federation of Labor, which opens its annual convention here tomorrow, lay the foundation for the establishment of an American labor party, leaders of the progressive wing of the federation declared tonight.

COAST DELEGATES ACTIVE. "We are here to sponsor a third party. If our plan is carried out there will be an American labor party within two years. Our movement may, however, be hastened if either one of the major parties adopt reactionary platforms in their national conventions."

Seattle Man Admitted. Representative of the Garment Workers' organization and other trade unions supporting the "One Big Union" will be aided in their fight by the One Big Union of Quebec, who at a meeting Friday night, bitterly denounced the federation as a "capitalistic organization no longer functioning by the workers'."
