

KIWANIS CODING INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION TO OPEN HERE TOMORROW.

CONFERENCE ARE HELD MORE THAN 1500 CLUB MEMBERS REPRESENTING ALL PARTS OF U. S. TO BE REGISTERED TONIGHT.

Though the principal programme of the fourth annual convention of the International Kiwanis club is not scheduled to open until tomorrow, conferences of importance to administrative officers of the organization will start at 10 o'clock this morning and continue throughout the day, without for moment conference rooms even for luncheon.

Hundreds of Kiwanis club members arrived in Portland yesterday and more than 1500 from widely separated sections of the United States and Canada will be registered tonight, if the expectation of the officers are realized.
