

JUDGE McCAMANT
ANSWERS CRITICSReply Made to Charge That
He "Violated Oath."

NOMINATING STORY TOLD

Speech That Carried Republican
Convention Off Its Feet Is
Given in Full.

Judge Wallace McCamant yesterday took up the cudgels in his own defense from the charge that he had "violated his oath of office" in not voting for Senator Johnson of California at the republican convention at Chicago. In making this reply to his critics Judge McCamant took issue with Newton McCoy, who is said to have made an accusation against Judge McCamant at the meeting of the democratic committee Saturday.

Judge McCamant addressed the following letter to Mr. McCoy:

"Portland, June 20, 1920.—Mr. Newton McCoy, Oregonian Building, Portland, Or. Dear Sir: It is reported in this morning's Oregonian that in a speech you delivered yesterday you stated that I had violated my oath of office. An oath of office is a matter of record and you, as a lawyer, know in what public office such an oath would be filed. If you have been correctly quoted, I ask that you secure and forward to me a certified copy of the oath referred to; also that you publish the oath, with accompanying certificate in The Oregonian. I will be glad to reimburse your expense in securing the copy and in publishing it. Very truly yours, WALLACE McCAMANT."

Responding to many requests that he explain the incidents that led up to his speech, Governor McCamant said he was speaking for the vice-presidential story was finally brought to light. Decision of the Oregon delegation to the republican convention to nominate Governor Coolidge for vice-president was made only after it had been very plain to them that Senator Lodge, for whom they were instructed, would not accept the honor.

Wallace McCamant, who was placed in nomination, thought it was only proper to explain the matter to him first," said Judge McCamant. "The Massachusetts senator was very positive in declining to be considered and said that his nomination would be embarrassing to him. We complied with his request."

Judge McCamant's nominating speech was very brief. Although it was extemporaneous, the Oregon delegate yesterday consented to formulate the following draft, as he remembered it:

Speech Terse and Pithy.
"The Oregon delegation came here directed by the republican party to our state to present the name of the senior senator from Massachusetts as a candidate for vice-president. This distinguished statesman has requested that we refrain from presenting his name, and we feel bound to respect his wish."

"There is another citizen of Massachusetts who has been most in the public eye during the past year. He stands for all those things which the republican party holds dear. His nomination for vice-president will assure the country that the republican party stands foursquare in its loyalty to those principles of law and order which are the foundation on which civilization is built."

"He is big enough and sound enough to be president of the United States should occasion require. In this bicentennial year of the landing at Plymouth it is peculiarly fitting that we put on our national ticket a gentleman of New England birth and ancestry whose public career exemplifies those principles which are the foundation on which civilization is built."

"Oregon presents the name of Governor Calvin Coolidge of Massachusetts."

SHRINE OFFICIALS BUSY

WILLIAM J. HOFMANN AND
HARVEY WELLS ON JOB.As General Chairman and Assistant

A five years' effort to bring the imperial council of the Mystic Shrine to Portland has culminated in the transformation of Portland into a city of oriental splendor. "The Portland session will be the greatest in the history of Shrinism," said Herman Reiborn, private secretary to W. Freeland Kendrick, imperial potentate, who has attended every imperial session for the last 16 years.

One of the interesting visitors to headquarters was Edwin S. Mereson of Lulu temple, Philadelphia. Noble Mereson has been appointed assistant chief of police of the Portland police department and is getting in a police official's uniform and a glittering star of silver, which was presented to him by Mayor Baker. Just what Assistant Chief Mereson's specific duties during the session will be, is not known, but one look at him assures one that he is fully capable of accomplishing anything that he desires.

D. G. Tomlinson of Al Kader temple served as representative of Chairman Hofmann in greeting the imperial potentate Kendrick, prior to his arrival in Portland.

RESPONSE IS MADE
TO CALL FOR CARSThousands of Visitors Are
Taken for Rides.

AUTO NEED IMPERATIVE

Chairman of Committee Urges All
Owners to Report Whether
Called Upon or Not.

Two thousand Shriners and their ladies enjoyed the hospitality of Portland automobile owners yesterday. Except for a few brief moments, sufficient cars were on hand at all times to care for the visitors who desired to view the Columbia river highway or the residential section of the city.

Ira F. Powers, chairman of the automobile committee, expressed satisfaction over the response of the automobile owners yesterday and urged every car owner who has signed with the committee to furnish cars to report at headquarters today for service, even though no telephone call is made.

"Automobiles will be needed sorely today. We can use all the cars that we can obtain between 9 A. M. and 11 A. M. today," said Mr. Powers. "We will also need cars in the afternoon from 1:30 to 2:30 o'clock."

"Because of the large amount of work falling on the committee it is impossible to telephone to car owners that we need them. All persons who have registered cars are asked to report today, whether or not they receive instructions by telephone to do so."

It is admitted that the best opportunity Portland has to impress the visitors with the natural wonders of this city and its environs is to take them over the Columbia river highway and on trips around Portland. Hence it is explained, Portland automobile owners should give the services of their cars and one driver as often as is possible during the present week, reporting to the automobile headquarters on Sixth street whenever the opportunity presents.

Gasoline cards will be furnished to every car owner who presents his card for use by the visitors. In doing this, however, it is necessary that the car is pressed into service as a "visitor's car."

In addition, an official visitor's automobile card will be furnished to all car owners who donate the use of their cars during Shrine week.

ELECTIONS ARE CERTIFIED

Secretary of State Mails Notices
to Winners.

SALEM, Or., June 20.—(Special.)—Certificates of nomination affecting all successful candidates of the republican and democratic parties at the recent primary election were mailed by Sam Koser, secretary of state, today.

In case where a candidate of one party was defeated, but received the nomination of another party, he will not receive a certificate. Refusal by the secretary of state to issue these certificates is authorized under a law passed at the 1919 session of the legislature and which became effective for the first time at the recent primary contest.

The official canvass of votes shows that for several offices throughout the state the candidates have been notified to appear in person or by their attorneys at the secretary of state's office in the near future to determine their nomination by drawing lots. None of the tie affect important offices and are confined mostly to precinct contests.
