**PARADE ENTRIES MUST BE IN POSITION BY 2 O'CLOCK**  
In order that the grand floral parade may move promptly and also that judges and camera men will have an opportunity to inspect the various floats prior to the hour of marching, all entries are requested to be in formation not later than 2 o'clock, taking their stations as designated in the order of formation.

Movement From Portland Begins at 3 P. M. Today.

**CONGESTION IS GREAT**

Suggestions Are Made to Shriners in Order to Expedite Work of Railroad Men.

**BAND, PATROLS AND NOBLES, THIS IS FOR YOUR EYES.**  
All baggage for trains leaving tonight must be ready by noon so the baggage committee can haul it to the depot.  
Other baggage must be at the union depot two hours prior to the scheduled train departure. It must be marked with the temple name and with the name of the noble.  
Trains will leave parking places two hours before departure time scheduled from union depot. They will remain in the depot 20 minutes. Megaphones will announce each temple as the train is ready. Take only hand baggage.  
All organizations are requested to meet in front of the Y. M. C. A. today at 10 A. M.

Fifty-seven special trains are scheduled to leave Portland in the 36-hour period beginning tonight.  
A complete schedule is printed herewith at the request of the traffic committee, the only means of reaching thousands of the nobles.  
Other special trains will be prepared as quickly as the accommodations can be obtained.  
Suggestions Are Made.  
R. E. Palmer, in charge of the railway terminal forces, who will work continuously for 48 hours until the conclusion of the convention, has the following suggestions to make last night:  
Nobles may enter trains at parking places any time up to two hours before train-leaving time.  
Trains will stay 30 minutes at the Union depot and may be boarded while there also. Only hand baggage should be carried, as the congestion will be great. Baggage should be sent down to the depot at least two hours before train departure time and marked plainly with the name of the temple.  
Megaphone men will announce the name of each train, the name of the temple and the home town of the temple.

**Congestion to Be Great.**  
The baggage of uniformed men should be ready at noon today so the baggage committee can move it to Union depot in good time to get on the trains.  
Railroad men urge nobles to follow directions implicitly so that they may be moved from Portland with the least delay.  
Some idea of the congestion is given from the statement there will be a train in every block between Portland and Tacoma and in between Portland and Seattle.
