Miss Landers is a most fascinating talker, who leads her hearers to feel that the site on which Indianapolis stands is hallowed ground because is the birthplace of Thomas Taggart.
Listening to her portrayal of the

Palmer, protesting his dryness while liquor dealers in some parts of the country sell whisky over the bar unmolested, is impossible of classification. Neither safe trusts him. side trusts him.

While Tammany is for Cox, Boss Murphy would be willing to accept Marshall because the latter, while not so pronouncedly wet, has a record of having secured the governorship of Indiana several years ago exclusively on the wet side of the liquor issue. On the train, as here, William Jennings Bryan was maligned by aimost everyone, and when a Cox delegate from Ohio joined the party at Ogden there was someone to organize the anti-Bryan forces, which included the supporters of McAdoo, Edwards and Marshall.
