It is the proposal of State Senator Norblad of Astoria to carve out a congressional district from what he is pleased to designate as "the maritime and timber counties." This plan would call for a district composed of all the Oregon counties which touch the Pacific ocean, with the exception that Senator Norblad would include Columbia county. His contention is that the coast counties, because of their harbors, fishing and timber.

Regardless of the many lower grades of muskrat fur, which can be doctored to sell at higher prices than they are worth, other skins of still lower value than the poorer muskrat are "treated" and soid by consolenceless dealers as the genuine.

Few people would consider entering the store of a diamond merchant of unknown standing and buying a stone merely on his word that it was "the real thing," perfectly cut, first water, etc., yet there is more room for deception in selling muskrat fur, and most people know less about it than about gems.


