On May 15 last the Knox substitute for the Versailles treaty was passed by the republican senate; and this convention can contrive no more fitting characterization of its obloquy than that made in the Forum magazine of December, 1918, by Henry Cabot Lodge, when he said:

"If we send our armies and young men abroad to be killed and wounded in northern France and Flanders with no result but this, our entrance into war with such an intention was a serial state of the constitution of the country to revise devised under pressure of imperative necessity to produce a revenue for war purposes is indefensible and can only result in lasting injury to the people.
