Price of Cleveland delivered a lecture on "A New Interpretation of Dental Inspections and their Oral and Systematic Expressions." Aa noon Dr. Arthur E. Smith of Chicago, Dr. A. A. Ward of San Francisco and Dr. E. T. Tinker of Minneapolis conducted classes which were followed by luncheon at College inn.


