Hubbard, Seattle inventor of a device, which, for ant of a better name, he terms an nospheric power generator, today made good his prediction that he would drive a motorboat with the apparatus as a source of power. An 18-foot boat, driven by a 25-resepower electric motor, which ob-ined its current from the Hubbard

To guard against the possibility of rdinary storage batteries concealed bout the boat as a power source, setead of the Hubbard coil, both dring was revealed. The coil used sufficient to drive an automobile The electric motor was approxi-pately 12 inches in diameter and 18 Inches in length. It had been re-constructed in order to be used with Hubbard coil.

After his ride in the strangely powered craft, the capitalist de-dared frankly that he was puzzled, ut that he desired an electrical en-ineer in his employ to make an ex-mination of the coil before he felt free to discuss it.

Capitalist Is Skeptic. Since last December Hubbard has en more or less in retirement per-cting his coil. He took up his esidence in Everett, where with the assistance of Everett backers he worked on his device. 
