During the following three de-1860. During the following three decades, 1860-90, the population of the state increased more than five-fold, the percentages of increase ranging from 73.3 to 92.2 per cent. Between 1830 and 1910 the population more than doubled. The numerical increase in the decade 1900-10 was nearly one and a half times the entire population of the state in 1880.

Comparison of the rates of increase for the state with those for the United States shows that during every decade the growth of the state was more rapid than the growth of the country as a whole. The population of the state in 1910 was somewhat more than 50 times as large as in 1850, while the population of the United States in 1910 was slightly less than four times that in 1850.

the official 1920 census for the state of Oregon has been placed at 783,285, or an increase of but 110,720 over the official government census of 1910. The state's gain in population during the ten-year period was at the rate of 184 per cent.

Persons who were in a position to note the strides taken by numerous communities and the sections of the state during the last few years confidently expected that the official tabulation would place this state well above the 900,000 mark. In some quarters there was a disposition to criticise the work and method of the census bureau, but in the main the feeling was expressed that it behoves the people of Oregon to roll up their shirt sleeves and get right.


