Comparison of the rates of increase for the state with those for the United States shows that during every decade the growth of the state was more rapid than the growth of the country as a whole.

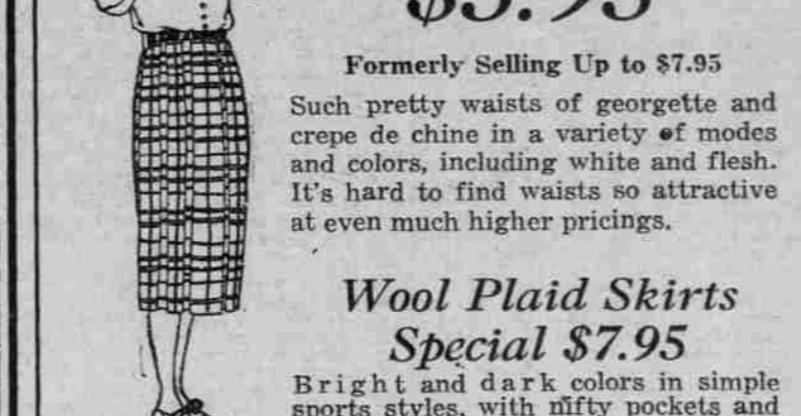
