## rejected by a large majority. PRISONERS MAY BE EXILED

Measure Permits Transfer to Any Jail in United Kingdom. WASHINGTON, Aug. 6 .- (By the Associated Press.)-Any person up whom sentence of imprisonment has been passed in Ireland could be conveyed to and detained in any prison in the United Kingdom under terms of the Irish coercion bill which passed the third reading today in the British house of commons, it was announced by the British embassy. This section applies to persons already

sentenced as well as those who may hereafter be sentenced. in general, the new law would transfer the duties of crown tribunals in Ireland to courtsmartial. military courts also would take over duties of coroners and would have the speaches, power to decide cases without jury.

The text of the bill says: Where it appears to his majesty in suncil that, owing to the existence of a state of disorder in Ireland the rdinary law is inadequate for the prevention and punishment of crime the maintenance of order, his majesty in council may issue regulations under the defense of the realm consolidation act. 1914 (hereinafter referred to as the principal act), for securing the restoration and maintenance of order in Ireland and as to the powers and duties for that purpose of the lord lieutenant and the hief secretary and of members of his majesty's forces and other persons acting on his majesty's behalf and in particular regulations for the speial purpose hereinafter mentione

The provisions of the Principal act with respect to the trial by courts martial or courts of summary jurisdiction and punishment of persons committing offenses against the detense of the realm regulations shall extend to the trial and punishment of persons who have committed crime in ireland, whether before or after the passing of this act, including persons ommitted for trial against etments have been found, however. thut: Any crime, when so tried, shall be
