

WOMAN DROWNED BY HUSBAND, JURY SAYS

Astoria Man Held Responsible for Wife's Death.

FULL CONFESSION IS MADE

Olaf Anderson Tells of Plan to End Both His and Companion's Life by Plunge From Boat.

ASTORIA, Or., Aug. 6.—(Special.)—“We find that Minnie Cecil Anderson came to her death by drowning at the hands of her husband, Olaf Anderson, August 1, 1920, while he was in a jealous and quarrelsome frame of mind.”

That was the verdict returned this afternoon by the coroner's jury called to investigate the drowning, which occurred last Saturday.

Anderson was arraigned in justice court this afternoon on information charging him with manslaughter, and his preliminary hearing was set for tomorrow morning.

The man's confession last night followed three days of intermittent grilling by the coroner, district attorney, sheriff, state and city officers.

After being told that the body of his wife had been recovered, and that the chain of evidence against him was gradually tightening, Anderson, who had maintained a dogged demeanor since his arrest, broke into tears and exclaimed: “I'll tell you the whole truth. My boy's story is true. I drowned my wife.”

Anderson Tells Story.

“Sunday morning we started out for a ride in my brother's boat and went toward the Miller Sand,” he said. “My wife and I were quarreling. She said she was going to leave me and take both the children. That made me mad. After we had tied the boat to the stake, I got up from my seat, went behind my wife, picked her up and then jumped overboard. I was intending to drown both of us. After getting into the water, I saw that the children, who were in the boat, were about to fall overboard, so I let go of my wife and went back to the boat. I saw Mrs. Anderson twice for a second before she went down. When Wilfred, my 4-year-old son, asked me where his mamma was, I told him Mamma had been drowned. I then came back to town and reported the drowning to Coroner Hughes.”

Anderson shook like a leaf as he told his story, and when taken back to the county jail he said to Sheriff Nelson: “I guess I'll hang for this, but I'll sleep tonight anyway.”

The body of Mrs. Anderson, which was found on the beach near Flavel yesterday, was discovered by Kenneth Logan and Albert Glenaville, who were en route to the river to go bathing. The body will be sent to Brownsville, Or., for interment.

Two Children Survive.

Mrs. Anderson was born at Ecker, Cal., 22 years ago, and had been married six years. Besides her husband, 24 years, aged 36, she has two children, 2½ years, and a 4-year-old son. She is survived by her father, Oliver P. Brookbank, of Brownsville, and her mother, Mrs. Elma Alexander, Brownsville, and T. B. Brookbank, Lewiston, Idaho.

RAMONA PAVING FINISHED

LARGEST SINGLE IMPROVEMENT PROJECT THIS YEAR.

31,864 Square Yards Hardsurfaced; Job Completed at Cost of \$55,123.

The largest single improvement project undertaken in Portland this season was completed yesterday by the municipal paving plant. This job, comprising the hardsurfacing of the Ramona avenue improvement district comprises 31,864 square yards.

Although the city estimated that the job would cost \$57,214.64, the work was completed at a cost of \$55,123.46. The difference between the cost of the work and the estimates will be credited back to the property owners in the district.

According to Superintendent Dulin of the paving plant, a profit of 10 per cent was made on the job amounting to \$2,788.87 which will be transferred to the general fund to be credited to money taken from that fund to establish the plant.

One contractor bid on the Ramona avenue project. This bid amounted to \$73,309.87 or \$18,888.19 in excess of the city's bid and about \$17,000 above the actual cost of the work.

ROAD BIDS TO BE OPENED

Highway Commission to Meet in Portland on August 24.

SALEM, Or., Aug. 6.—(Special.)—At a meeting of the state highway commission in Portland, August 24, bids will be opened on \$1,500,000 state highway bonds. If they are sold, the total bonded indebtedness of the state will be increased to \$15,547,750.

The bonds will be in denominations of \$1000 each, except that each 38th bond will be of \$500 denomination. The bonds will mature serially, \$37,500 October 1, 1925, and a like amount each April 1 and October 1 until the full amount is paid. The rate of interest will be 4½ per cent, payable semi-annually, April 1 and October 1.

FAIR HAS ATTRACTIONS

Boat and Auto Races, Carnival Among Wasco Features.

THE DALLES, Or., Aug. 6.—(Special.)—Attractions of boat races, automobile races, a carnival and the biggest agricultural, horticultural and industrial exhibit of many years will feature this year's Wasco county fair to be held here October 4, 5, 6 and 7.

It is planned to have agricultural and horticultural experts give demonstrations and lectures on grain and fruit grading, care of crops and orchards, marketing and other subjects pertinent to the success of the farmer.

AIRPLANE LAW PLANNED

Commissioner Fears Machines Fly Too Low Over City.

Speed limits for airplanes are unnecessary, but an ordinance requiring planes to maintain a certain height while over the city will prob-

ably be presented to the city council for consideration by City Commissioner Barbur, according to announcement yesterday.

Commissioner Barbur believes that some of the airplanes operated in Portland are flying too low. Observations made from his office window in the city hall, he says, convince him that unless some steps are taken to require the pilots to keep up in the air, disaster is certain to result.

The city official plans to confer with those interested in the flying game for the purpose of obtaining data, after which an ordinance will probably be prepared.

Commissioner Barbur contends that virtually every large city in the east has been forced to prepare legislation to control low flying.

In several cities serious accidents have resulted because of low flights.

NIGHT INTRUDER CAUGHT

YOUNG SOLDIER FOUND IN NEWPORT CONFECTIONERY.

Youth on Furlough From Vancouver Given Sentence of 60 Days in Jail.

NEWPORT, Or., Aug. 6.—(Special.)—Otto McLaughlin, aged 18, private in the 44th United States infantry, stationed at Vancouver barracks, Washington, was captured crouching behind a counter in a confectionery store by Carl S. Davis, the proprietor, at midnight last night.

He was sentenced to serve 60 days in the Lincoln county jail, at Toledo, by Justice Berry today. A charge of housebreaking was changed to larceny, McLaughlin agreeing to plead guilty to that charge. The government will be advised of his whereabouts, as he is believed to be a deserter from the army.

McLaughlin had gained entrance through a rear window after Davis had closed the place for the night. McLaughlin was unarmed and offered no resistance.

McLaughlin said he was absent on a five-day furlough, which has not yet expired. He sold his uniform and wears overalls and a felt hat, army shirt and shoes. His family formerly resided in Newport, where his father, Clark McLaughlin, worked on the jetty. McLaughlin said he had come to Newport to visit them before his regiment left for San Francisco. Discovering that they had moved away, he said he entered the Davis store to find a place to sleep.

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
