

Poles Take Prisoners.

The communique reports successes for the Poles in the region of Cholm, and Brubieszow, where the Poles took more than 100 prisoners, including the Eussian chief of staff and much war material. In the south the soviet forces took Sokal. Further south-west the Poles evaduated Brody, which previously had changed hands several times.

In the region of Sochotsin the Poles took 600 prisoners and captured 120 truckloads of munitions and 80 truckids of provisions




