

GROCERS RESENT FULL AT RULING ON MILK

Loss Declared Sustained on Every 100 Quarts.

CISAPPROVAL IS VOICED

Producers Want More White Disruptors Look Forward to Passing Rise to Consumers.

Both the milk distributors and producers have accepted the ruling of the newly appointed milk commission pending the exhaustive investigation promised by members of this commission.

Portland grocers, however, are ready to revolt, asserting that to accept the ruling of the commission would mean a loss of 70 cents on every 100 quarts.

Eyes on Consumer.

Although the new prices established by the milk commission, the milk producers are frank in stating that they expected a higher price for their products.

The average consumer is happy, however, for the order which increases the wholesale price of milk from \$2.90 a hundred pounds to \$3.55 does not provide for any change in the retail price of milk.

Grocers Dislike Loss.

Portland grocers will be forced either to refuse to handle milk or to defy public indignation and increase the price of milk handled by them to a figure which will offset the recommendation of the milk commission.

Portland Grocers Have Been Making a Net Profit of 20 Cents on Every 100 Quarts of Milk They Handle.

Under the recommendations of the milk commission they would lose 70 cents on every 100 quarts. The grocers and selling \$12 that amount for \$15. That gives them a gross profit of \$3. Over the cost of doing business in Portland average \$2.70, which left them a net profit of 30 cents.

Injustice Is Alleged.

As it is justice for the milk producer to take advantage of his position without even consulting him as to his cost of doing business or attempting to find out how much profit has been made? Not a retailer was consulted by the commission and no effort made to find out what his costs or his profits are in the handling of milk.
