Portland Inquiry Given Seattle, Says Chamber Head

OPEN ACCUSATION MADE

Act, It Is Said, Shows Necessity for New Operating District for Portland.

Mayor Aids Fight to Create New Region.

PORTLAND FEARS INJURY

Competition Between City and Seattle So Keen That Discrimination Will Result.

Continuation of Portland in the Seattle shipping district, with the last-minute change of the headquarters, is regarded by Portland residents as an intolerable condition, injurious to both the nation and Oregon.

Separate District Wanted.

The message which Mayor Baker sent to Washington is as follows: "As mayor of the city of Portland, Oregon, and speaking with some knowledge of the shipping situation on the Pacific coast, I am convinced that the advisability of creating a separate district for Portland so that the energies of our people may be fully employed doing their share of Oregon's shipping business, is an American merchant marine.

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 7.—The freight steamer City of Omaha, bound for Kobe from San Francisco with general cargo and previously reported ashore near Yokohama, was floated with assistance and taken into Yokohama, where it sunk, according to a report from London received here by the marine department of the chamber of commerce. The deck of the steamer lay about a foot above water at low tide, the report said.

Cargo of Rags Coming.

The steamship Havilah, which arrived at Astoria August 25, will be loaded with rags from the Columbia river.
