BERKELEY, Cal., Sept. 9.—(Special)—Wallace Bates, Missouri champion and ranking racketeer at the University of California, furnished the galleries the surprise of the state meet today, defeating Robert Kinsey, California wizard, who ranked 11th nationally last year, in straight sets, 10-8, 7-5.

Bates played the game of his life, continually aceing Kinsey on tape shots driven with the power of cannon balls.

Kinsey varied his strokes in an effort to throw Bates off his stride, but wind off form. Bates wouldn't be denied, and scored perfectly from both sides, making remarkable ace-smashes at the net.
