The picketing, in protest against the incarceration of Terence Mac-Swiney, lord mayor of Cork, dying in Brixton prison of self-imposed starvation, which resulted yesterday in the walkout of stevedores engaged in coaling the British steamer Muncaster Castle, was continued along the waterfront today.

Picket Spread Predicted.

Extension of the picketing to the northern ports of the Pacific coast was predicted by members of the league following the receipt of a mes-sage from New York to the effect that a vigorous campaign is to be gotten under way. Plans for a boy-cott of all British goods in line with the boycott campaign mapped out in New York, together with a movement against industries in California con-trolled by British interests, are under

consideration, it was intimated.

The pickets made their appearance along the waterfront at 7 o'clock this morning and for two hours paraded The pickets made their appearance along the waterfront at 7 o'clock this morning and for two hours paraded the Embarcadero. In addition to their appeal by hanners and by word of mouth to stevedores on specific tasks, they made a special appeal to the longshoremen at work. They left the waterfront at 9 o'clock, returning at 11:30 for two hours more of picketing.

In addition to the original banners carried during yesterday's demonstration two new banners were in syldence. They read:

"Will you help send food to Enginal while they starve the Irish in their jails?"

"The Irish republic is the only labor government west of Russia. Will you help kill it?"

The Muncaster Castle was the only British veesel in port yesterday. She completed her coaling yesterday afternoon and steamed for Hongkons. The picketing is not expected to be a daily incident. It will start automatically with the arrival in port of a British boat and every effort will be made to induce the stevedores to

## **GOOD HAY CROP SECURED**

FIRST CUTTING OF ALFALFA HEAVIER THAN USUAL.

Small Damage Done by Summer Rains - Harvest Conditions Reported by Counties.

County reports on crop conditions sent to P. L. Kent of the bureau of crop estimates are summarized as follows:

Baker—Present outlock for all kinds of grain is the best in years. Good rains have started grass on the range. Good crop of hay, put up in fine condition.

Henton—Hecent rains should improve corn and late potations. Threshing delayed for four or five days, but little damage gots. Some pears being picked for cancerios; large percentage of small sizes.

Clackamas—July rain came too late to be of much henefit to grain. Threshing about half done. Apples light crop, due to December, 1919, freeze.

Douglas—Summer rains have in most mainarcest come too late. Corn will be very good but late and soft. Potatoes irregular in growth. Grain yield not up to expectations.

Deschutes—Potato crop damaged by froat about 40 per cent. First cutting of alfalfa was heavier than usual, but secend cutting will be below normal because of continued cool weather.

Gilliam—Harvest about half over. Average wheat yield, 15 to 20 harbely

Gilliam Harvest about half over Average wheat yield, 15 to 29 bushels per burse; barley, 25 to 35 bushels. Potatoes will be fairly plentiful. Wool still a drug on the market. of the market.

Jefferson Spring wheat not turning out as well as expected. Pasture better than last year, but not as good as usual. Alfaifa hey appears to be a little better

falls hay appears to be a little better then usual.

Klamath-Rains have held back growth for siffalfa 10 to 15 days. Second cutting probably about 70 per cent of first cutting. Some grain damaged by frost and being cut for hay. Outs badly damaged by blackbirds; some wheat still green and will probably fall to make grain on account of frost.

Linn—Threshing in full blast now, Most of the spring grain turning out fairly well, although considerably hurt by hot weather of mid-August.

Lake—Extreme hot weather during ripening of grain caused some shriveling.

Maineur—Generally speaking, all crops are good, all that had been expected, except fruit of all kinds, which was badydamaged by the severe freeze of last winter. What apples we have are of good quality.


