DRY WORK COMPLICATED

SEARCH FOR BOOTLEGGERS IS MADE MORE DIFFICULT. Warrants Henceforth Practically Will Be Equivalent to a Preliminary Hearing.

Work of revenue officers searching for bootleggers will be no simple matter hereafter as a result of the decision Monday by Federal Judge Wolverson relative to the present form of search warrants.

The decision roused considerable complaint around the federal building yesterday, officers maintaining it would handicap them in making prosecutions.

They have been in the habit of working on tips without being required to disclose the name of the informant, but this will be necessary on the new form of warrant. It is felt that men will fear to have their names connected with the search and will no so readily report bootlegging operations.
