KING COUNTY TICKET NAMED

155 Out of 391 Delegates Answered Rollcall.

OLIVE BRANCH HELD OUT
Surface Harmony Prevails at Convention in Seattle; Cottrell Beaten for State Secretary.

SEATTLE, Wash., Sept. 14.—(Special.)—While the major political parties were assembling their nominees in the state-wide primary today, delegates representing the labor party met at Yakima in July to formulate a platform program. Under the call, 391 delegates were entitled to seats and 155 responded to their names, according to the report of the credential committee. Twenty-four counties were represented. The non-partisan league, the committee of 48, the workers' republican league and the triple alliance were the units most conspicuously active in the creation of the new party. The rally men's welfare league, which also met at Yakima, did not participate, nor was it recognized in any manner, directly or indirectly.

Olive Branch in Evidence.
David C. Coates, state chairman of the farmer-labor party, was elected permanent chairman of the convention and C. R. Cottrell of Kent, a former officer of the old triple alliance, permanent secretary. Cottrell placed Coates in nomination, which was followed by the nomination of Cottrell for secretary by a member of the Coates organization. This was an indication that the olive branch was very much in evidence, inasmuch as Cottrell and the Coates-Short factions had a falling out several months ago which nearly disrupted the triple alliance. Surface harmony prevailed throughout the convention, although when it came to the nomination of state officers Cottrell was defeated for secretary of state by a vote of 124 to 223. Major C. A. Harlin of Wenatchee, a retired butcher, winning King county vote 41 for Harlin 3 for Cottrell, and Pierce county voted 224 for Cottrell to 42 votes for Harlin.

The convention delegated to a nominating committee the task of submitting a list of recommendations and with but two exceptions the report of the committee was adopted by the convention. Robert Adair of Olympia, a former employe of the state industrial insurance commission, was nominated for state auditor. G. I. Masten of Tacoma, a railway employe, and Elmer S. Smith of Centralia, who was secretary of the defense state acquitted in the trial of the men charged with the "armistice day murders," was nominated for attorney general over Charles E. Sampson of Bellingham, who had received the highest vote in the committee. Frankly marked the remainder of the nominations after the contests had been decided.

Geographical Lines Drawn.
Geographical considerations dictated some of the nominations, and there was a general tendency on the part of the committee and the delegates to make an equitable distribution of the offices among the consolidated units represented in the new party. The farmers' non-partisan league was represented by the nomination of Robert Bridges for governor, E. W. Bowles of Prosser for lieutenant-governor and the workers' republican league obtained the nomination of its state organizer, Frank Pease, for secretary. Specialists probably will be charged with the nomination of C. A. Harlin of Wenatchee for secretary of state, the state grange is represented by the nomination of A. M. Meekling of Tacoma for insurance commissioner, and women got three presidential electoral votes and the nomination for superintendent of public instruction, which is the scattering election, was Robert Adair, nominated for state auditor. Elmer S. Smith for attorney general and three presidential electors to their credit. Paul K. Mohr of Seattle started the machinery that put the name of Smith on the ballot.

Bridges is Acclaimed.
Robert Bridges, selected at the Yakima convention as the choice of nearly all the participating groups as their candidate for governor, received the nomination by acclamation yesterday. C. J. France defeated C. J. Chamberlain of Fuyallup for nomination as United States senator. C. P. Bush of Clark county, who presided over the convention of the farmer's non-partisan league at Yakima, was defeated for lieutenant-governor by E. W. Bowles of Prosser. Bush was a member of the populist legislature in 1917 when Bridges was state land commissioner, and this point was urged in his favor on the floor by the delegate who submitted his name. Senator Iverson of Polk county, who was defeated for the state senate, was defeated for the state senate and representatives and a full county ticket. Alcohol Antis in Conference.
WASHINGTON, Sept. 14.—Anti-Saloon league leaders gathered today for a three-day conference beginning tomorrow in a preliminary to the international congress against alcoholism, which will meet next Tuesday. The Prohibition Commission, Chamber and Wayne A. Wheeler, general counsel of the league, will be the principal speakers at the opening session.

Defeat Traced to Row.
The defeat of Chamberlain for nomination as United States senator may be traced, in part to his row with William Short, president of the federation of labor, at the time Cottrell and Short clashed in the nomination of a candidate for state secretary. Chamberlain went over to the non-partisan league and was not active in triple alliance quarters.

Jean Stovall, speaking for the women, urged the nomination of Rev. M. H. Marvin for lieutenant-governor. Marvin made a plea for harmony, declaring that the report of the nominating committee should be ratified if possible, inasmuch as the committee had given close attention to the problem of geography in the distribution of the offices. He withdrew his name. Bridges pledged the influence of his office, if elected, to preserving the guarantees under the constitution of

Policies of Washington and Monroe Menaced.

ISSUES DECLARED CLEAR

Idaho Senator Delivers Address in Governor's Home Town—Two Positions Contrasted.

DAYTON, O., Sept. 14.—With the assertion that, if elected, Governor Cox "will scrap the policies of Washington and Monroe," Senator Borah of Idaho, in a speech in Governor Cox's home city tonight, declared the issue between Harding and Cox clear cut.

Two Positions Contrasted.
"Senator Harding has declared his unalterable opposition to Article 10, declaring that it represents not justice but force, not liberty but oppression, not peace but war," the Idaho senator declared. "While we know Governor Cox would use his great powers as president to see that the contract covered in Article 10 and 11 is made binding the whole nation to use, if necessary, all our wealth and power in guaranteeing the territorial integrity of all other members of the league.

Referendum is Prepared.
"No election of peace will ever be worthy of a people's confidence which does not place the power of peace or war in the hands of those who will taxes and fight the battles," Borah said.
