

CROWD EXPECTED AT REPUBLICAN RALLY

Iowa Governor to Get Enthusiastic Welcome.

EXECUTIVE GOOD FIGHTER

Reputation as Campaigner Already Made—Robert N. Stanfield to Introduce Speaker.

Robert N. Stanfield, republican nominee for United States senator, will introduce Governor Harding of Iowa at the Harding-Coolidge ratification rally at the auditorium Saturday night.

We are getting splendid reports on the ability of Governor Harding as a campaigner, said Chairman Tongue, who made one of the best speeches at the Chicago convention nominating Governor Harding. Men who know Governor Harding said that as a speaker he rivals the candidate for president himself.

Chairman Tongue will preside. Governor Harding will be met at the union station by a reception committee of republicans and former Iowans. The latter are, in order, Knott street, in the coming of the governor of their former state and they are planning to attend the rally in force and also to sing as a number during the evening of the Iowa state song, "Where the Tall Corn Grows." Before the arrival of the speaker beginning at 7:30 P. M., W. R. Boone will play several numbers on the organ. Solos and campaign songs by quartets will enliven the programme.

Invitations to attend the rally have been sent to all republican clubs and to the republican editors of the state. Republican clubs of neighboring counties are planning to send large delegations.

COLLEGE GIRLS ELECTED Willamette Chooses Y. W. C. A. Officers for Semester.

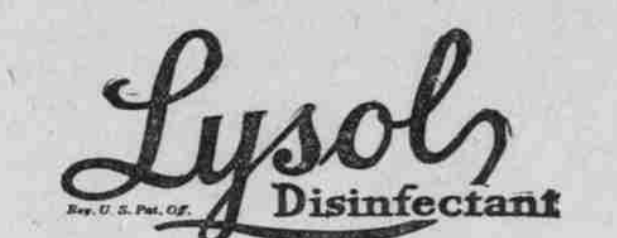

ALBANY, Or., Sept. 15.—(Special.)—The county courts of Marion and Linn counties today probably may not be able to complete the new steel bridge across the North Santiam river at Mehama this year, as a result of high water in the river this week, which washed out the false structural work.
