"Several persons, mostly with pronounced German accents, questioned the governor at different places. Some appeared friendly and caused the governor to give his views on questions interesting his audience.

"We have no quarrel with any national bitterness in America," the governor said.

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JAPANESE MUST GO, DECLARES BARROWS

Possession of California Land Held U. S. Doom.

"SMOKE SCREEN" CHARGED

Nippon Resorts to Ruse to Distract Attention From Aim, Says President of University.

BERKELEY, Cal., Sept. 28.—Possession of land in California by Japanese means the doom of the United States, President David P. Barrows of the University of California said in a statement today setting forth his stand on the Japanese question.

"We are trying to hold a large frontier in California, much larger than people in other sections of the country realize, unless they have visited the Pacific coast. The doom of the United States is the possession of this region by orientals and we, as educators, realize that it must stop now."

"Under the 'smoke screen' which is raising in pretense of domestic agitation in California, she is undoubtedly planning a bold move in either Siberia, Manchuria or Mongolia. She is trespassing upon the sacred rights of China, to all of which we are indifferent."

"We Californians are accused in the east of being sensationalists. California sees the menace and is united to oppose it."

"This is not due to our own personal prejudices for California labor, but it embraces every class in the state, and we are banded together in a determined league to force the exclusion of the yellow man from our boundaries."

"The time has come for civilization to have some common sense and stop wasting its resources for the purpose of attacking Germany."
