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Ex-Assistant War Secretary Can't Trust Cox.

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Harding Said to Be Wisely Non-Committal on Pact Because of Shifting World Affairs.

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"Now that President Wilson is retiring from active political life," said Major Crowell, "it is wise for his supporters to pause and take stock of the situation. I have always favored a league of nations and am sorry we did not enter it long ago. The democratic party, however, has no monopoly on the league or nations."

Cox's Promises Nonsense.

"It seems evident that Governor Cox is making many promises regarding the league which he may not be able to fulfill," said Harding.

Efficiency Big Issue.

"An efficient administration, in my opinion, is the great issue in this election. Senator Harding's election will, I believe, insure more efficiency in the government than the election of Governor Cox, who has been compelled to accept the reluctant support of the government in the present administration that could contribute little to the strength of the next administration."

Registration in the University of Oregon medical school this year was the largest in the history of the institution. The last of the students matriculated Saturday, making a total of 40, of whom 20 are entered for the first time. It was necessary to limit the number of first-year students to 20 on this account as applications were rejected, although all had passed entrance requirements.
