MALARIA DANGER FOUND

DISEASE-BEARING MOSQUITOES DISCOVERED AT OSWEGO.

Dr. Smith, State Board of Health Chairman, Declares Drainage of Lake Will Be Asked

Two distinct types of malaria-bearg mosquitoes were found yesterday in and around Oswego lake by officers of the state board of health and Lieuenant Mars of the United States pubic health service.

As a result of these discoveries, Dr. Andrew C. Smith, chairman of the Andrew C. Smith, chairman of the state board of health, said he will go before that body at its next meeting and recommend that a sufficient appropriation be sought to enable the state to drain the lake.

"Our discoveries lead us to believe that Oswego lake will be a permanent menace to the people of that section and Portland as well unless the lake is drained," said Dr. Smith yesterday. "It would be possible to use oil each year during the summer months but this would be an annual expense and also would spoil the lake as a resort." The first malaria-bearing mosquito was found by Lieutenant Mars several
