

PROSPERITY COMING, SAYS REALTY CHIEF

Period of Pronounced Building Activity Forecast.

TAYLOR HOME FROM EAST

Head of National Association of Real Estate Boards Reports on Progress and Prospects.

Students of business conditions among the leading realtors of the country are unanimous in predicting a full decade of unprecedented prosperity, according to F. E. Taylor, president of the national association of real estate boards, who returned to Portland yesterday after a month's tour which included visits in the larger cities of the east and middle west.

Every sign points to pronounced building activity, commencing soon after the first of the year, Mr. Taylor says. He reports a pronounced shortage in all classes of realty improvements throughout the country and declares that the Pacific northwest should profit immeasurably by the expected impetus soon to be given the lumber market.

During his travels, which were made in official capacity as head of America's realtors, Mr. Taylor delivered addresses before business men and realtors in Chicago, Detroit, Indianapolis, St. Louis, Kansas City, Omaha, Council Bluffs, Pittsburg, Lincoln, Denver, Colorado Springs and Boise.

Northwest Now Recognized.

In these cities he had an opportunity to talk with thousands of substantial business men and investors and to sense the eastern attitude toward Portland, and he says that he found that the Oregon metropolis and the entire Pacific northwest now are recognized as never before. Frequently his hosts spoke in a complimentary way of the Columbia river highway, Frank Branch Riley and the entertainment accorded the visiting Shriners at last summer's convention. Much capital and many desirable home-seekers are headed this way, Mr. Taylor says.

As a result of the work accomplished at the meeting of the executive committee of the national association of real estate boards, at which Mr. Taylor presided in Denver, the association has established a new bureau for research and information at Washington, D. C.

Chicago Headquarters Now.

Another constructive step was the transfer of the national headquarters from Minneapolis, where it has been located for many years, to Chicago, which is a more central point. National Secretary Ingersoll will be provided with a greatly increased office force, including a public relations secretary and a publicity expert, who will be charged with the responsibility of carrying on a country-wide educational campaign.

Through co-operation of the research bureau and the Chicago headquarters, monthly bulletins touching on questions of legislation, taxation, housing and kindred topics relating to real estate. The first bulletin will be issued this month.

In the face of recent census figures, which show an increased drift of population from the country to the cities, the realtors are planning an energetic "back to the farm" campaign similar to the "buy your own home" movement which swept the entire country in recent years.

Farm Service Pledged.
The realtors have placed the service of their farm land committee at the disposal of Secretary of Agriculture Meredith and have pledged support and co-operation in their constructive campaign to make farm life more attractive by building good roads and better schools, and by extending metropolitan comforts and conveniences to the country districts as far as possible.

While in Chicago Mr. Taylor found that the realtors of that city already are laying plans for the next annual convention of real estate boards to be held next July. It is predicted that this convention, which will terminate Mr. Taylor's term as president, will be the largest convention of business men ever held in the United States. An attendance of at least 5000 is expected.

JAPANESE KILLED BY CAR

Gardener, Loading Car, Falls to Note Approach of Train.

QUINCY, Or., Oct. 12.—(Special.)—Falling to note approach of the Oregon Electric limited Thursday evening, T. Kishihara, Japanese gardener of Lake Labish, was instantly killed as he was loading a car with celery.

His limbs were torn from his body and practically every bone broken as he was dragged beneath his truck down the track. A widow and son survive him.

16,000 Rats Killed.

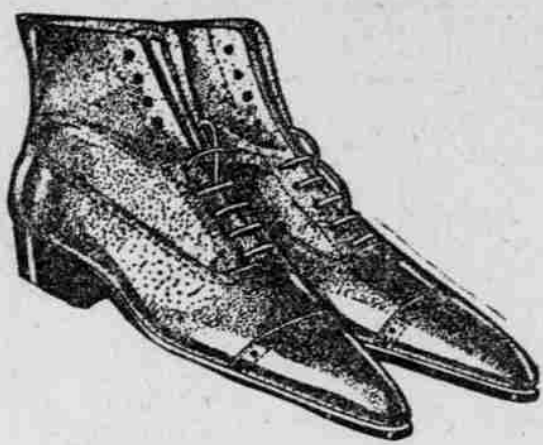

HOUSE HARBORING STILL SET

ABLAZE BY U. S. AGENTS.

Announcement Made All Moon-

shine Establishments Will Be

Fired From Now On.

SEATTLE, Wash., Oct. 12.—(Special.)—Houses and structures concealing illicit stills will be burned to the ground hereafter when found, Donald A. McDonald, federal prohibition director for Washington, announced today.

He stated he is acting on instructions from Robert C. Saunders, United States district attorney.

Agents last night set a torch to a building one mile east of Newport, on Lake Washington, where they discovered two stills.

Director McDonald explained that the Volstead act calls for destruction of all property connected with the illicit distillation, including buildings in which a still is harbored.

The director did not know this morning who owned the building burned down by his agents last evening. They

were unable to make any arrests as a result of their find.

The building was hidden in the dense underbrush east of Newport.

Its approach was guarded by trees which had been felled across a path.

Destroyed with the building in the fire which agents set to the place were 400 pounds of molasses, eight barrels of raisins and molasses mash, two gasoline stoves and a kerosene stove. The raid was made as a result of information given by persons who stumbled on the distilling plant while hunting.

Youthful Robbers Caught.

EUGENE, Or., Oct. 12.—(Special.)—George Prather and Howard Clark, 14 and 12 years respectively, were yesterday committed to the state industrial school for boys at Salem.

These boys admitted entering a number of places of business recently and committing thefts. They were caught a few nights ago by Officer Jenkins in the act of attempting to enter a hardware store. Two other boys were with them at the time but they were too young to send to the school.

Apple Growers Refuse Holiday.

HOOD RIVER, Or., Oct. 12.—(Special.)—Columbus day slipped by on many orchards, who were disappointed when they called at banks to withdraw funds for harvest

help. Several county officers, too, forgot that the day was a legal holiday until they discovered the banks closed this morning. Taking advantage of the full day without showers since harvest has begun, apple growers celebrated Columbus day by picking a record quantity of apples for the season.

Phone Rate Lift Authorized.

SALEM, Or., Oct. 12.—(Special.)—The Oregon public service commission in an order issued here today authorized a slight increase in the rates of the Lafayette telephone company, with headquarters at Lafayette, Yamhill county. The estimated value

of the property is \$500 and it serves about 60 patrons exclusive of subscribers on farmer-owned lines. The increase in rates will become effective October 16.

Jacksonville Starts Fight.

MEDFORD, Or., Oct. 12.—(Special.)—The fight of the people of Jacksonville to have the courthouse retained in that city and to have the voters moved down the proposition to move it to Medford at the November election was publicly inaugurated in Medford tonight when Colonel H. H. Sargent, champion of the present county seat, delivered an address in the natatorium in this city.
