On Sunday, following the punch bowl, there will be an inter-club competition between Waverley and the Seattle Golf club.

Manager Dorman will take 22 players with him and expects to use them all.

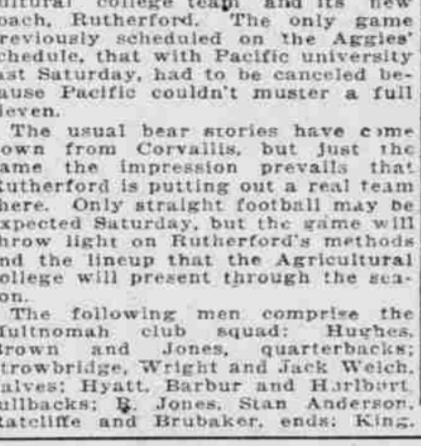

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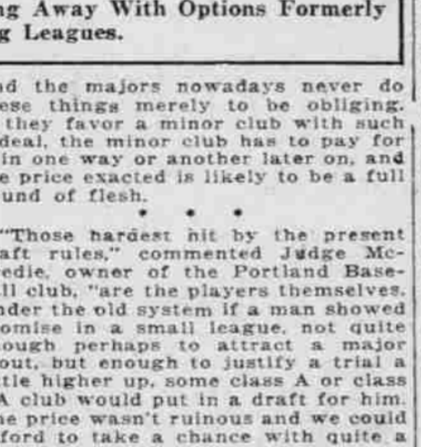
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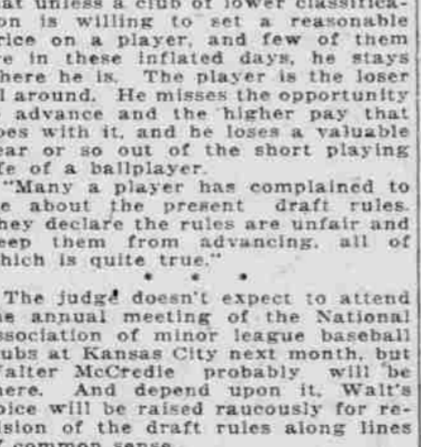
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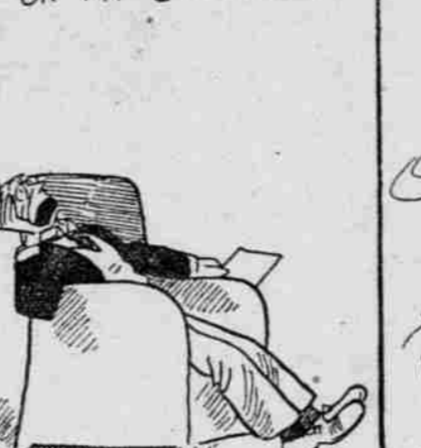


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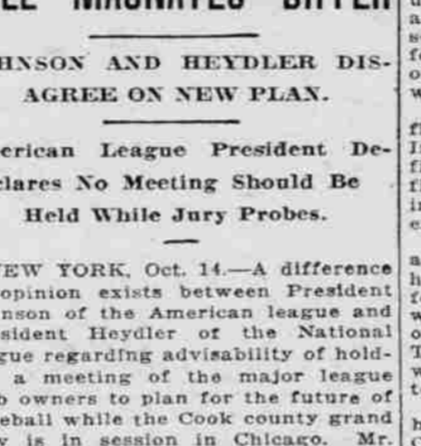
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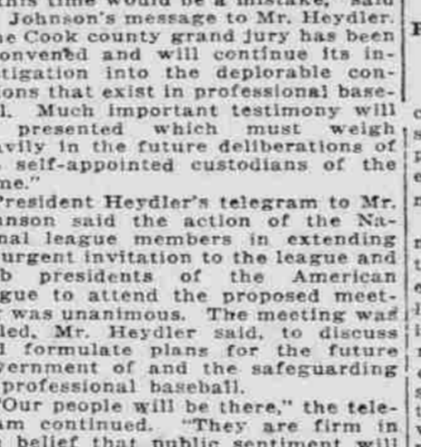
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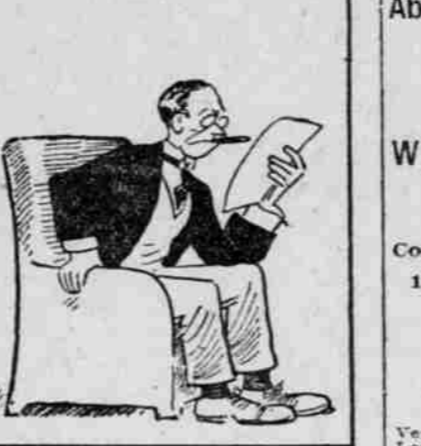


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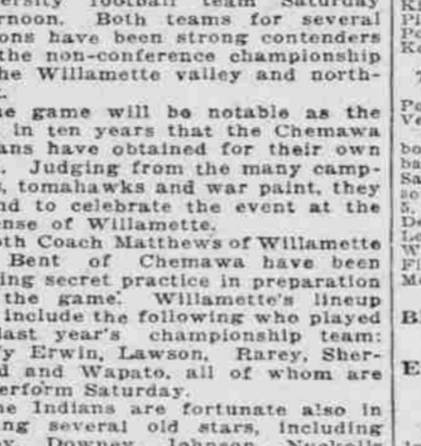
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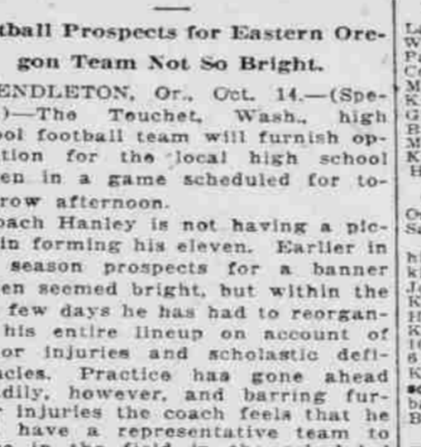
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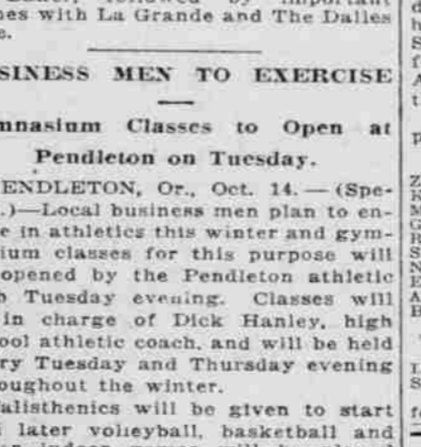
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VERNON WINS, 5 TO 3 AND GETS PENNANT

BALL MAGNATES DIFFER

JOHNSON AND HEYDLER DISAGREE ON NEW PLAN.

American League President Declares No Meeting Should Be Held While Jury Probes.

NEW YORK, Oct. 14.—A difference of opinion exists between President Johnson of the American league and President Heydler of the National league regarding advisability of holding a meeting of the major league club owners to plan for the future of baseball while the Cook county grand jury is in session in Chicago.

Heydler tonight made public telegrams passed between him and Mr. Johnson relative to the meeting called for next Monday at Chicago.

"It is my judgment that to hold a meeting of major league club owners at this time would be a mistake," Mr. Johnson's message to Mr. Heydler.

"The Cook county grand jury has been reconstituted and its investigation into the deplorable conditions that exist in professional baseball."

President Heydler's telegram to Mr. Johnson declared the action of the National league members in extending an urgent invitation to the league and club presidents of the American league to attend the proposed meeting was unanimous.

Injuries to Stendal and Davis, halfbacks, slowed down the smashing offensive of Pendleton later.

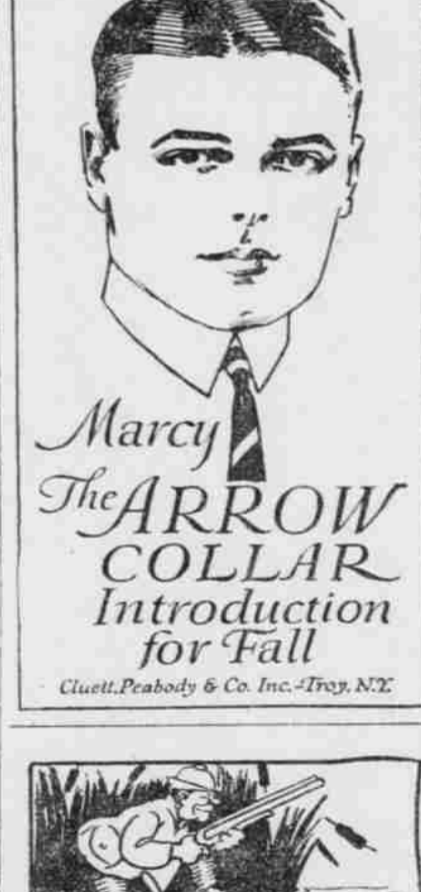
Morton Hanley, brother of Coach Hanley, quarterback, whose brilliant work was one of the outstanding features of the game, was taken out.

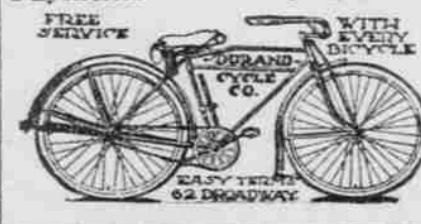
