CHICAGO, Oct. 18.—The Cook county grand jury investigating the baseball scandal does not expect further testimony implicating major league players in gambling and game "throwing," but will devote its future sessions to securing evidence against the men who are alleged to have "fixed" the 1919 world's series by bribing Chicago American league players to lose games to the Cincinnati National league team, according to a statement tonight by Hartley Replogie, prosecutor in charge of the inquiry.
