

3000 AT COLLEGE FAIR

STATE AGRICULTURAL STUDENTS EXHIBIT PRODUCTS.

Home Economics Girls Show Handiwork While Mechanics Demonstrate Farm Appliances.

OREGON AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE, Corvallis, Oct. 27.—(Special.) Approximately 3000 persons attended the Ag fair last Saturday afternoon and evening in the college armory under the direction of the school of agriculture and the Ag club. The various departments had their booths full of products, consisting of everything from dresses made by the home economics girls, to farm appliances being demonstrated by the farm mechanics students. A parade was held in the evening.

Alfred W. Loy of Buena Vista won first prize of \$10 in the department scoring contest, while E. R. Peterson of North Bend won second place and the \$5 prize. The animal husbandry men won the Dean Cordley cup in the department contest. They also won the cup given by the First National bank of Corvallis. W. C. Jones of Ottawa, Kan., won first prize in the upper classmen's contest, a round trip ticket to Portland, and a pass to the Pacific International livestock show. Eugene Hubbard, Corvallis, won first place in the under classmen's contest, getting a free initiation into the Withycombe club and a ticket to the livestock show. W. S. Taylor and Ronald Hager, Salem, were given honorable mention.

A roasted chicken, the prize in the egg guessing contest, was won by C. E. Baker of Los Angeles, while William Caldwell was awarded a ten-pound roast of beef as second prize. Wallace E. Niles of Grants Pass was manager of the fair and Frank Brown of Walla Walla, Wash., assistant manager. Bob Warren, Portland, had charge of the exhibits and Leo Spitzbarl, Salem, handled the publicity. Harry Weiman of Umanine, Ore., was treasurer, and Professors C. H. Ruck and O. M. Nelson were faculty advisers. Judges were O. M. Plummer and N. C. Maris of Portland, and W. H. Savage of Corvallis.

She was slightly injured by the fall, and police took her into custody. The girl, who is held by the women's protective division, ran away from a boarding school near Cornelius, Ore., last week. Her mother lives at 287 Yamhill street. The girl is held as a witness against Gilbert Anderson, who faces prosecution for contributing to her delinquency.

YAQUINA FISHING GOOD

Old Residents Say Salmon Bite Better Than for 14 Years.

NEWPORT, Or., Oct. 27.—(Special.)—Old residents say it has been 14 years since salmon fishing in Yaquina bay has been even one-half as good as it is now. At present the fish are biting hungrily and it is a daily event to walk down the streets with from three to a dozen beautiful silver-sided, caught in from one to three hours. Two Newport women recently caught two dozen big salmon without assistance.

The good fishing this year is attributed to the unusual amount of fresh water in the bay.

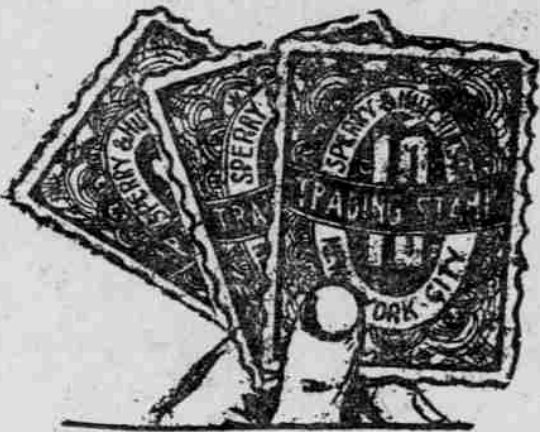

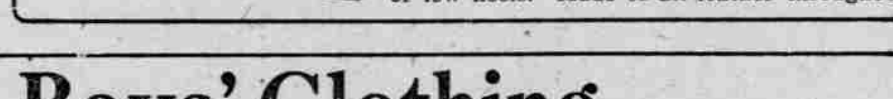
