Evidence against the officers was submitted to Chief of Police Jenkins by Lewis Emera, 22, and William S. Gilbert, 25, who are in the county jail for alleged bootlegging operations. In affidavits signed by these men, Huntington and Russell took 29 bottles of whiskey from them during a raid on October 19. They also got two revolvers, the affidavits allege.

Huntington has been on the police force since 1911, and Russell since 1912. They have been members of the morals squad at irregular intervals but in 1915 of the 29 bottles and never turned in either of the revolvers, it is charged.
