WASHINGTON HOLDS EXTRA WIN OVER OREGON SQUAD

Universities Have Met on Gridiron Fifteen Times, Sun Dodgers Winning Seven, Beavers Six, and Two Games Being Tied.

BY L. H. GREGORY. FIFTEEN times in the past 20 years have the Universities of Oregon and Washington met at football, and of those 15 games Washington has won seven and Oregon six.

When team weights are considered there is little to favor either eleven. The lightest man from either team averages 173 pounds to the man, as against 174 1/2 for Washington.
