POLICE ON TRIAL TODAY

HUNTINGTON AND RUSSELL UP FOR THEFT CHARGE.

Confessed Bootleggers in Jail Declare Officers Retained Liquor Taken in Raid.

Trial of Patrolmen Huntington and Russell of the police morals squad will be held at 10 o'clock this morning before the police efficiency board. They are charged with the theft of liquor which they took from Lewis Emma and William D. Gilbert, confessed bootleggers who are now serving sentences in the county jail.

Sergeant Ellis, in command of the morals squad, will be called before the efficiency board to give whatever information he may have concerning the alleged operations of his two men.

Both Huntington and Russell yesterday branded the charges against them as a "frame-up" on the part of the two convicted bootleggers.

Hert E. Haney, former United States attorney, said last night he is preparing a petition to President Wilson on behalf of both Emma and Gilbert and it will be ready for circulation this morning.

The petition, he said, is based solely on the plea that the sentence of six months in jail, which the federal court meted out to both, is too severe for a first offense.

"I was retained by relatives of the two men to assist in procuring a pardon," said Mr. Haney. "I started the preparation of these petitions before I knew that Emma and Gilbert had signed affidavits accusing the police. This petition for a pardon has nothing to do with the charges against these two policemen."

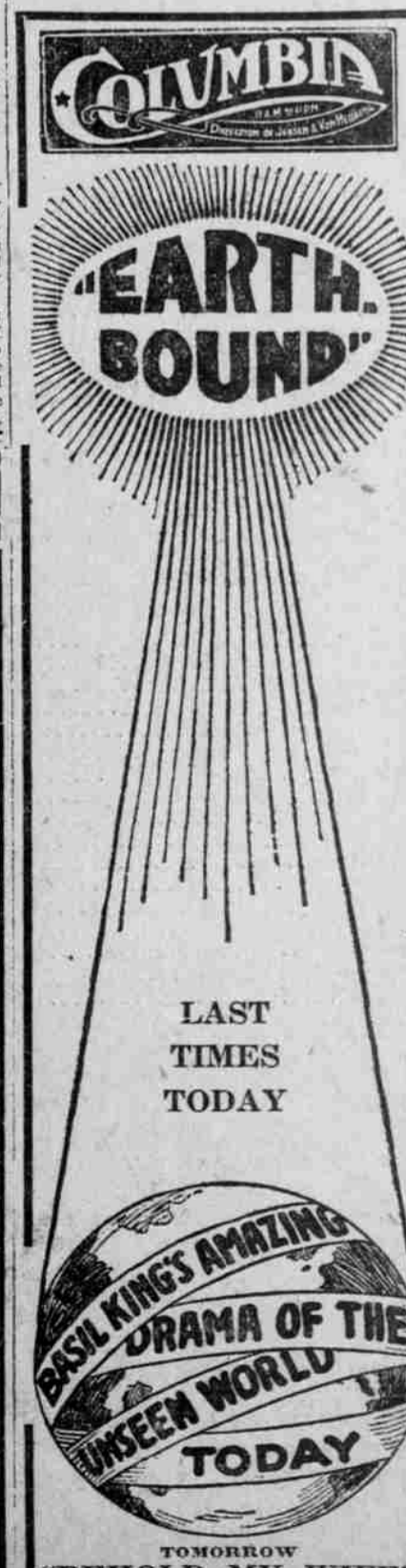
