Secretary of State Would Conserve Finances.

CAPITOL IS CONGESTED

Construction Urged in Lieu of New Building Under Prevalling High Material Cost.

SALEM, Or., Nov. 28.—(Special)—Addition of two stories to the supreme court building in lieu of erecting a new structure under prevailing high cost of labor and materials is advocated by Sam A. Koser, secretary of state, in case the state board of control and legislature deem it expedient to provide more room for this building for the neighborhood.

Secretary of state Koser has estimated that the cost of two additional stories to the supreme court building would be for the neighborhood about \$125,000, while the erection of a modern office structure on the capitol grounds would cost \$350,000.

Capitol Is Congested. "I deem it expedient at this time to direct the attention of the board of control to the extremely congested condition existing in the capitol and supreme court building," said a statement prepared by Mr. Koser today.

Space Demand Increases. "The demands for space will be greater from time to time as the natural growth of the state requires."
