

and trappers operating in Oregon and Washington. The bulk of the shipment was made up of skins of coyotes with those of some wildcats and other animals. The entire shipment will bring less than \$1000 this year and could prob-ably find no market except for a government contract with the fur dealers. Last year the same ship-ment would have brought more than \$10,000, according to the estimate of the local officials.
