Republican Leaders to Be Taken With Transports.

SYSTEM TO BEGIN TODAY

Proclamation Is Issued by General Officer Commanding District of Kerry.

DUBLIN, Dec. 19.—The general officer commanding the Kerry district has issued a proclamation that after December 20 Irish republican army officers and leaders in custody will be sent as hostages with all transports moving armed forces of the crown by roads in the martial law areas.

Two men who had been in the custody of the military barracks at Castle Tipperary, were shot dead Saturday night.

"IRISH BILL" DECLARED VAIN
