

GRANT IS ELECTED AS CITY ATTORNEY

Choice Made Unanimous on Second Ballot.

TOMLINSON ONLY RIVAL

Newly-Elected Official Will Begin Duties Immediately, Making One Change Among Deputies.

Frank S. Grant, yesterday was elected city attorney to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of W. P. LaRoché, who retired from municipal service to re-enter private practice and to defend John L. Etheridge, ex-president of Morris Brothers, Inc.

The election of Mr. Grant was unanimous on the second ballot. H. M. Tomlinson, assistant city attorney, received two votes on the first ballot.

City Commissioner Pier nominated Mr. Tomlinson to the position, after a letter recommending Tomlinson for the position, signed by Federal Judge Dean, had been read. City Commissioner Higelow seconded the motion.

Barber Nominates Grant. Commissioner Barber then nominated Mr. Grant, Commissioner Mann seconding the nomination. A poll of the council gave Mr. Grant three votes, Mayor Baker casting his vote for him, while Mr. Tomlinson had two votes.

Commissioner Pier then moved the unanimous election of Mr. Grant, which motion prevailed.

The new city attorney was notified of his appointment, which is effective at 12 o'clock tonight, and in response to a summons from the council immediately went to the city hall.

He was notified formally of his election by Mayor Baker, and accepted the honor in a short address in which he gave high praise to his predecessor.

Immediately thereafter he was sworn in by Chief Deputy Auditor Grutze.

One Deputy to Retire. Because of a charter provision, which removes all deputies employed in the city attorney's office upon the retirement of the city attorney, Mr. Grant signed an order reappointing all present deputies.

When asked if he contemplated any changes in the force now employed in the legal department, City Attorney Grant stated that he planned no changes with the possible one exception. Just what change was contemplated could not be explained at this time, Mr. Grant said.

The deputies now employed in the city attorney's office are H. M. Tomlinson, L. E. Latourrette, Stanley Myers, Lionel C. Mackay and E. Y. Lansing Jr.

Succeeds Own Successor. Mr. Grant served as city attorney for several years, having been advanced to this position from a deputyship under J. P. Kavanagh, now circuit judge in Multnomah county. He retired from the city attorney's office in 1913, having been succeeded by W. P. LaRoché, whose 5-year tenure will close officially today.

Mr. Grant is illustrious potentate of Al Kader temple, Mystic Shrine, and also holds a chair in the Sunnyside chapter, Royal Arch Masons. He is also a prominent member of the Knights of Pythias.

FOREST MEN TO CONFER

WEEK'S MEETING OF SUPERVISORS FEB. 14 TO 21.

Conference to Be Round Table Discussion of Divisions of Work Carried on in Forests.

Forest supervisors from Oregon and Washington will gather in Portland for the first time since 1917 for a week's conference February 14 to 21. Plans for the meeting, which will be attended by 24 supervisors, are now being completed by George H. Cecil, district forester, who will preside.

The conference will be a round table discussion of all the various divisions of work carried on in forests and for an interchange of ideas among the supervisors.

C. E. Rachford, grazing inspector from Washington, D. C., will be present and will speak on "Grazing Administration." C. S. Chapman will speak on "Fire Co-operation" and E. T. Allen on "A Programme of Forestry for the Nation."

Open discussions will be held at each meeting with a supervisor in charge of the general programme. The meetings are planned in this way, since they are to be informal.

District Forester Cecil has arranged the committee as follows: General forest administration, A. H. Sylvester of Wenatchee, Wash.; personnel problems, R. M. Evans, Baker; forest improvements, R. E. Shelley, Eugene; fire protection, F. H. Brundage, Portland; grazing, G. H. Brown, Lakeview; forest management, W. G. Weigle, Seattle; lands and recreation, Thomas A. Sherrard, Portland; entertainment, E. N. Kavanagh, Portland.

OFFICE HAS BUSY YEAR

5346 Persons Helped by Federal Employment Service.

EUGENE, Or., Jan. 7.—(Special).—The report for the past year of the local branch of the United States employment service, made out by Manager Armitage, shows that 5346 persons were directed to employers through the office. Of this number 4736 were men and 610 women.

The sawmills and lumber camps were the largest employers of men in this district in the past year, according to the report, although farmers and fruit growers were furnished a great deal of help through the office during harvest and the picking season.

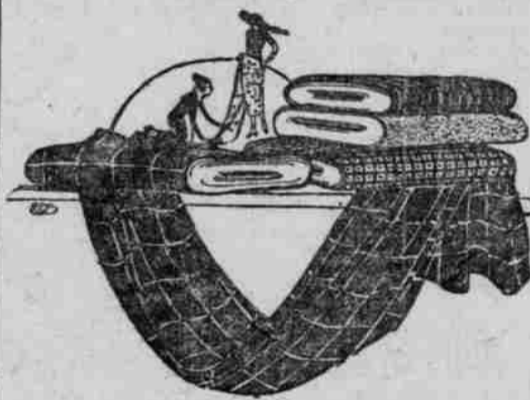
