

SEWER PROBE STOPS CONTRACTORS' PAY

Thousands of Dollars Held Up by Investigation.

MAJOR DEFECTS FOUND

Faulty Construction Charged; One Inspector Fired, Others Laid Off; Engineer Suspended.

Payments on contracts for the construction of sewerage involving thousands of dollars, have been held up by A. L. Barbur, commissioner of public works, pending the outcome of a thorough investigation into the work of unfinished and recently completed sewer systems.

The withholding of payments on a wholesale scale comes as a climax to discovery of major defects in the construction of recent sewer systems, which have already resulted in the discharge of one inspector, the laying off of several more and the suspension of an assistant city engineer.

Responsibility Is Denied.

W. A. MacQuigan, the inspector who was discharged, through his attorney, Rogers MacVee, last night issued a statement in which he denied responsibility for the faulty work and said that he had reported the defects to his superior officer, only to have nothing done in the matter. MacQuigan is a veteran of the British and American forces.

The defective work was discovered in the Minnesota and Alameda-avenue sewer system, constructed by the firm of Asar & Co. at a contract price of \$10,200. According to officials of the department of public works, the joints of the sewer were cemented only on top to pass a superficial examination and were not cemented all around as provided for in the specifications.

MacQuigan discovered the defects in the work," said MacVee last night, "and he reported them to those higher up. He was simply told to patch them up and go ahead. When the discovery was made by department head officials he was fired by his immediate superior, without even receiving so much as a hearing. MacQuigan feels that he has not been treated fairly, and he wants to have his side of the controversy heard, before being judged. He did his work and did it well, as other inspectors can testify.

\$100,000 Held Up.
In all, approximately \$100,000 for the construction of sewer systems in the Peninsula district has been withheld from the Asar company, while a minute examination is being made of the work. Another contractor, Alex Daroff, has felt the wrath of the city. Payment for two contracts calling for more than \$3000 has been denied him temporarily.

Daroff has been ordered to repair certain defects in one system which he constructed, known as First street and Terwilliger avenue system, and to have test pits made on another on Webster street, between Eighth street and Union avenue. Daroff has objected and placed the matter in the hands of an attorney.

Payments on other recent construction work is being held in temporary abeyance, while the work is being completely tested.

Bonds Held Good.
"In all contract work on sewer construction, the firm undertaking the contract must post a bond," said Mr. Barbur yesterday in explaining the city's position. "This bond is good for two years and is for the amount at which the contract is let. Our experience has been that if there are any defects in work, they will show up within that two-year period and the contracting firm must repair them, or the bond will be forfeited. That will be the procedure in this instance."

"None of the inspectors who were engaged on the sewer work saw any of the city payroll. Some of them were laid off before the discovery of the alleged defects. Others were discharged, following the finding of the faulty work, which should have been caught at the time and prevented by the inspectors."
