WOOL PLANT ORGANIZED

SCOURING WILL BE FEATURE OF WAREHOUSE CONCERN.

Clips Will Be Shipped to Market by Water After Cleansing Process Has Been Applied.

Machinery has been ordered for the large wool-scouring plant that will be one of the facilities of the Western Wool Warehouse, to be located next spring at the foot of Richmond street, St. Johns.

Western Wool Warehouse has an authorized capital of \$2,000,000 and has been organized by a number of Oregon bankers and wool men, with a view to affording additional finance to the wool men of the west, at the same time providing scouring facilities that will make heavy grease wools more marketable. Inauguration of regular shipments will be made by water as a result of scouring, which will afford a saving of freight rates to the grower averaging

from \$1 to \$1.50 the 100 pounds, it is said.

Oregon Invaded by Meat Firm.
MEDFORD, Or., Jan. 20.—(Special.)—A trade invasion of the Southern Oregon field by the Santa Clara Valley Meat company of San Francisco is announced in the purchase of William Lewis, Rogue River valley sheep man, of 1000 head of mutton at a price ranging from 7 to 7 1/2 cents, for immediate shipment. The same company is dickering with stockmen of the valley for heavy shipments of beef cattle.

CITY FIRMS TO GET EDGE

OFFICIAL PROMISES AID TO HOME INDUSTRIES.

Announcement Made as Result of Complaint of Alleged Discrimination by Furniture Concern.

Portland firms hereafter will get every possible advantage in furnishing supplies to the city, according to S. C. Pier, commissioner of finance. The move is taken to strengthen home industries to create as much work as possible in the city and to relieve the unemployment situation.

The announcement yesterday by the commissioner came as a result of a complaint of alleged discrimination lodged by a local firm recently. The concern, the Albattross Metal Furniture company, in stating communications to the city officials, entered vehement protests against the manner in which specifications for supplies for the municipal isolation hospital were advertised. The amount involved was about \$12,000. In the specifications a call was

made for goods of a standard set as "Reid Bros. or equal." Exception was taken to that, as follows: "Just why a Portland factory that specializes in this kind of work should be required to build furniture to conform with the specifications of Reid Bros., a Seattle factory, we are at a loss to understand."
The matter was taken up with J. L. Hooper, purchasing agent, who stated that the specifications had been prepared by the department of public utilities, of which John M. Mann is commissioner. Mr. Mann was in Salem yesterday, but his assistant, H. A. Goode, said he doubted if Mr. Mann had ever seen the specifications if they were drawn up in the form stated.

Mine Development Planned.
RIDDLE, Or., Jan. 20.—(Special.)—Announcement has been made that development work on a considerable scale will begin shortly on the mining property of the Oregon Development company, located in the Silver Peak district adjacent to this place. A new wagon road and several hundred feet of tunneling are planned. The property is owned by a number of local people, with whom a Mr. Van Ziepel of Portland is associated. The veins of the ore are mostly copper, with gold and silver and some other rarer metals in less quantity.

CITY'S PLEA IS DRAFTED

PORTION OF AUTO LICENSE MONEY IS DESIRED.

Bill Providing for Diversion of Percentage to Municipalities to Go to Legislature.

The bill prepared by City Attorney Grant at the request of A. L. Barbur, commissioner of public works, would return to the city for expenditure in the maintenance of streets 20 per cent of all money paid by Multnomah county residents for state automobile licenses, will be submitted to the city council today for approval before being transmitted to the legislature.
The proposed legislation would divide the 25 per cent allowance now given to Multnomah county into two parts, leaving 5 per cent only for the use of the county commissioners in the building of roads outside of the city limits. The county commissioners at present receive the entire 25 per cent, the remaining 75 per cent going to the state highway commission

for use in building roads throughout the state.
It is estimated that the proposed bill would give the city approximately \$140,000 annually to spend in repairing and maintaining streets. Accompanying the bill prepared by Mr. Grant was an opinion by the city attorney to the effect that the city is required to keep all city streets in repair at its own expense, until such time as further repairs are deemed impracticable and new pavement must be laid.
This practically abrogates the municipal ordinance which decrees that the city shall keep all pavement in a state of repair for a period of ten years, and extends the period to the life of the pavement. It will also greatly increase city expenses, according to Assistant Commissioner of Public Works Johnson.
It is planned to have the city council officially approve the bill at a special meeting this afternoon, and then submit it to some member of the Multnomah delegation to the legislature.
A merry fight over the project is expected from the county commissioners. To ally this to some degree the city councilmen are not asking to have the measure retroactive, but would have it effective in 1922.
Most of the pavement in the city will come out from under the ten-year clause by the fall of 1921, according to Assistant Commissioner

Johnson, and much expense in maintaining the city's streets is expected in the next few years.
INTELLIGENCE WORK TOLD
Critic of Independence School Speaks at Monmouth Normal.
MONMOUTH, Or., Jan. 20.—(Special.)—Miss Emily de Vore, first and second grade critic of the independence Training school, gave an interesting chapel talk to the students of the Oregon Normal school in the auditorium yesterday.
As an introduction Miss de Vore explained some of the details of the German intelligence test for school children. She demonstrated her explanation by an experiment.
Water Appropriations Reported.
SALEM, Or., Jan. 20.—(Special.)—In October, November and December 28 permits were issued by State Engineer Capper covering appropriation of water from various streams and other sources for the irrigation of 28,398 acres of land, the development of 180 horse power, domestic mining, fluming lumber and various other purposes at an estimated cost of approximately \$100,000. Seven reservoir permits were issued covering the storage of 3714 acre feet of water.
