Nation's Intentions as Mandatory Are Outlined.

NAVAL BASES ARE BARRED

TOKIO, March 24.—(By the Associated Press.)—Japan's intentions as mandatory for the former German islands in the Pacific, among them the island of Yap, were outlined in a two-word communique issued by the foreign office today.
