## FRASER ALLEGED THIEF

### LARCENY OF AUTO CHARGED TO BLUE-SKY PRISONER.

Alleged Violator of Stock-Selling  
Law is Defendant in Third  
Criminal Case.

Marshall Fraser is a crook, or a much misunderstood man. Twice he has been jailed after organizing stock companies in which the authorities believed he would be the only person to prosper through the investment of money by laboring men. While still in jail on the second charge and awaiting sentence after conviction on the first, a third complaint was issued against him yesterday, charging larceny of an automobile.

In the language of the complaint, signed by R. Satterthwaite of the Garford Oregon Motor Sales company, the charge is "larceny by bailment."

On December 15, 1920, Fraser bought a truck on contract from the Garford concern. It was alleged. Under terms of the agreement, the machine was not to be taken from the state. Not long after it was found by detectives employed by the firm in Spokane, Wash. Fraser was accused of shipping it there. Bail was set at \$1,000.

Though it did not appear in the complaint in this case, a further charge was brought to the attention of Deputy District Attorney Stockman. It was alleged that Fraser turned in, as part payment for his new truck, a second-hand truck to which he had no legal title.

## "HEDDERLY CASE" IS UP

### RE-TRIAL OF SUIT BY WIDOW IS STARTED.

Jury Is Selected and Opening  
Statements Are Made by Coun-  
sel for Each Side.

Re-trial of the rather well-known "Hedderly case," in which Mrs. Lena Hedderly, widow and administratrix of the estate of the late Robert W. Hedderly, killed by shots fired by prohibition officers while Hedderly was resisting arrest on a bootlegging charge, sued William R. Wood, James J. Higgins and Delazon Smith for damages of \$7500 each, was begun in federal court yesterday.

The jury was selected in the morning and opening statements were made of what each side expected to show to win a verdict. During the day the plaintiff's case, conducted by Barnett H. Goldstein, ex-assistant United States attorney, was presented in part and will be concluded today. Five witnesses, including the widow, were put on the stand by the plaintiff and they testified to the circumstances surrounding the death of Hedderly, who, according to the defense, was regarded as a bad man with a gun and dangerous when interferred with in his alleged bootlegging operations.

The defense, which is conducted by Assistant United States Attorney Veitch, will commence its case today.

## MOZOROSKY YET IN JAIL

### JUDGE BEAN REFUSES PLEA FOR GAMBLER'S RELEASE.

Writ of Habeas Corpus Denied to  
Winner of \$800 Who Lost in  
Suit Filed by Loser.
