**FIRE CODE IN MAKING**

**FEWER LOSSES IS AIM OF STATE MARSHAL.**

**Storage of Gasoline and Other Explosives Featured in New Regulations.**

SALEM, Or., June 13.—(Special)—Elimination of practically all fire hazards in Oregon and strict enforcement of restrictions made possible under a new law enacted at the last session of the legislature will be undertaken soon after July 1 by A. S. Barber, state fire marshal, and his assistants.

Representatives of the state fire marshal's department, together with persons connected with the Oregon insurance rating bureau, held a meeting here last week when the proposed new code was discussed. This code is now being prepared by the state fire marshal and will be ready to place in the hands of the enforcement officers by July 1.

The code will deal particularly with the storage of gasoline and other explosives, and an effort will be made to guard these inflammables that fires from their source will be almost impossible. Garage construction also will be featured in the new code.

Mr. Barber said today that under the rules and regulations to be adopted by his department, fire losses in Oregon should be reduced from 15 to 25 per cent.

**BUDGET BLANKS COMPILED**

**Frank Meredith Employed to Work Out Preliminary Details.**

SALEM, Or., June 13.—(Special)—Frank Meredith, former secretary of the state fair board, has been employed by Sam A. Kozier, secretary of state, to prepare the necessary blanks for putting into operation the state budget commission, created under an act of the 1921 legislature. Under this law the commission will compile biennial estimates of expenditures for all state departments.
