VOYAGE ANTARCTIC PLANNED BY BRITISH

Sir Ernest Shackleton to Command Expedition.

START TO BE IN AUGUST

Explorer Will Sail From London in "The Quest" for Trip of 30,000 Miles in South.

LONDON, June 28.—(By the Associated Press.)—Sir Ernest Shackleton, who commanded the British antarctic expedition in 1907-09, which reached within 97 miles of the south pole...

He will sail from the port of London at the end of August in a 200-ton ship, Britannia, rigged, named "The Quest."

The expedition will be called a Shackleton-Rossett geographical and antarctic expedition, will be financed by John Queller Rossett of agricultural research and Frederick B. Becker, a well-known paper manufacturer.

Salvages First Objective. The first objective will be the Salvages, a group of rocky islands in the Atlantic between the Canary and Madeira islands...

Shackleton then will go to Tristan da Cunha, in the south Atlantic, and to the other islands of the group.

Soundings will be taken of the ocean depths. Gough's island in an endeavor to settle the surmises regarding an underwater continental connection between Africa and America.

Big Tract to Be Visited. Enderbyland will be visited. This is a large tract, but whether a continent or an island is unknown, as its limits are entirely unknown.

The next country to attract the Quest will be New Zealand, and the island of Tuanki, which has been mentioned in old nautical records and native legends, but has since disappeared.

The Quest is now at Southampton. She is 111 feet long and 12 feet in breadth, with a 22-foot beam.
