PUPPILS OF HARRIS AND SIT AT RINGSIDE

Fight Is Mecca for Dignitaries of Nations.

5000 WOMEN ATTRACTED

Arena Seats Reserved for Society Leaders and Lights in Business and Musical Worlds.

NEW YORK, June 30.—When Jack Dempsey and Georges Carpentier face each other for the world's heavy-weight boxing championship in Jersey City Saturday there will be present a greater assembly of national dignitaries and nobilities than ever before attended a pugilistic contest in the history of the sport. France, England, Canada, Australia, Africa and even China and Japan have contributed their quotas in the crowd of fight fans already here. Many women are among the 5000 who are expected to attend. The many of them socially prominent in New York and other sections of the country will be present for the encounter.

At least one member of President Harding's cabinet, Attorney-General Daugherty, will sit at the ringside. Innumerable diplomats and political leaders, whose names command respect throughout the United States and foreign countries, are accompanying their reservations. Among the well-known business men and financiers who will attend are J. P. Morgan, Henry Ford, Harry Payne Whitney, W. B. Baruch, Harry F. Guggenheimer, Percy Rockefeller, Vincent Astor, Russell G. Colt and others of equal prominence. Theodore Roosevelt, Jr., assistant secretary of the navy, and Mrs. Roosevelt, Mr. and Mrs. Kermit Roosevelt, Mr. and Mrs. Nicholas Longworth, Governor Edwards of New Jersey, and Miss Anne Morgan will also be present.

Hundreds of celebrities in the musical, theatrical and moving picture worlds already have engaged ringside seats. Among them are David Belasco, John McCormick, Morris Gest, William Farum and "Eddie" Leonard. A party of 100 notables from the California moving picture field will arrive to see the fight and a special train bringing 1000 enthusiasts from the ranks of Chicago business men will reach here Friday morning.

James J. Jeffries, with his wife and daughter, will sit at the ringside. He will virtually all the erstwhile and present celebrities of pugilism, many of whom will be present from the ring before the contest. Jim Coffey, the San Francisco promoter, who has been in charge of the event since the Pacific coast, himself sponsored a number of championships. He has purchased his own private box for the event. Other prominent names on the list include James J. Corbett, Rex Beach, Walter Hodge, Harry Campbell, Sam Harris, "Big Bill" Edwards, William J. Flynn, director of the bureau of investigation of the department of justice, and the Cohans, A. J. Drexel Biddle and George W. Lott.

FIGHT PERMIT IS ISSUED

LEGAL DIFFICULTIES FOR BIG BOUT APPARENTLY OVER. Prosecutor Not to Present Complaint of Conspiracy Unless More Evidence Is Given.

NEW YORK, N. Y., June 30.—Robert L. Doherty, chairman of the New Jersey boxing commission, tonight issued the permit for the Carpentier-Dempsey contest to the New Jersey Athletic club and George L. (Tex) Rickard.

The issuance of the permit and the statement of Prosecutor Garven that he will not present the complaint of international reform bureau to the grand jury unless further evidence of conspiracy is presented, virtually disposes of all legal difficulties in the way of the contest.

In his letter Dr. Crafts declared that the intention of the reformers to prefer charges against the state attorney to Governor Edwards, made public today, demanded that he prevent the bout. Governor Edwards, before receiving the permit, stated:

"You may say that the fight will go on and will be conducted absolutely within the law."

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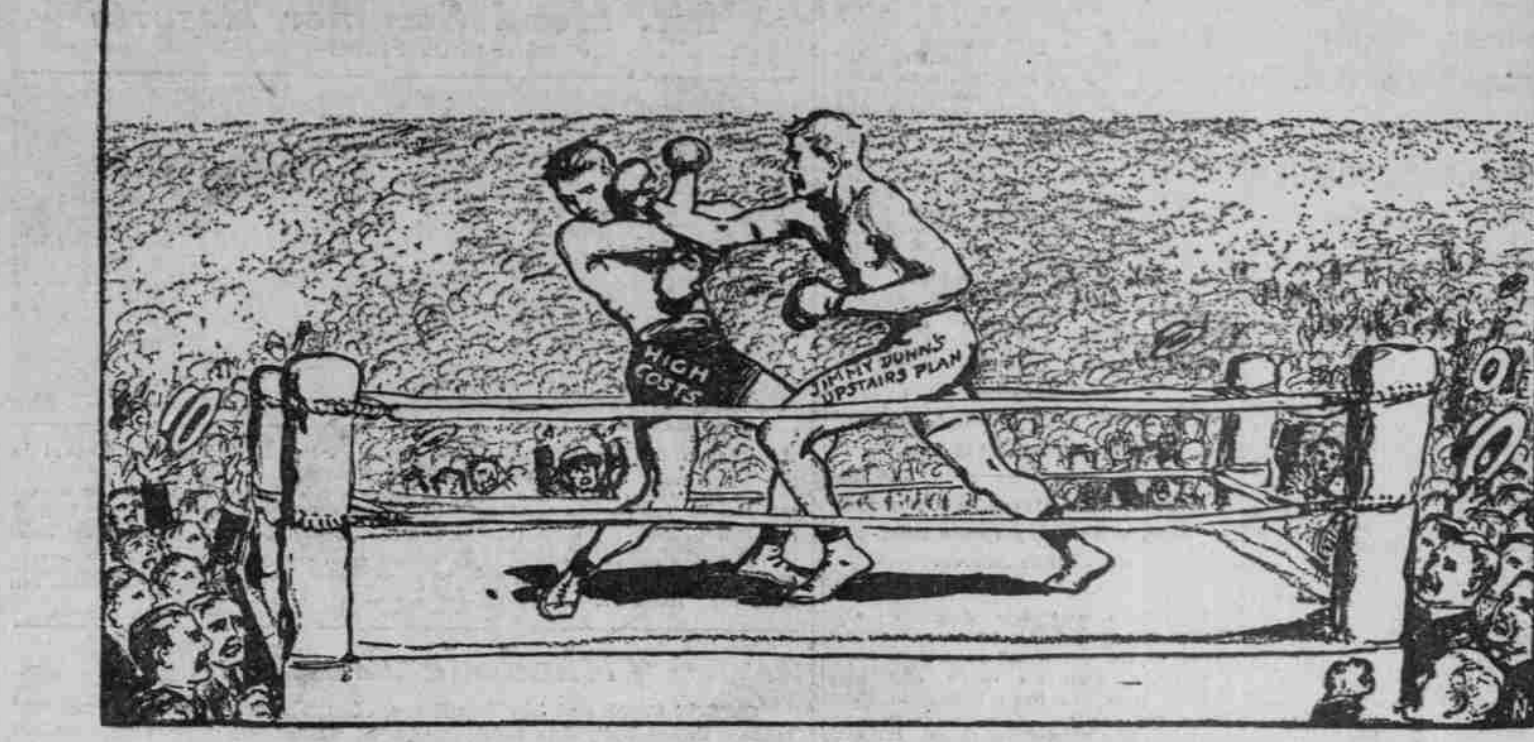
