MATERIALISM DECLARED FALSE.—In his lecture last night at 201 Central building, on "The Grave and What Lies Beyond It," Claude L. Watson, national lecturer for the Theosophical society declared that there is no longer such a thing as "scientific materialism." "Sir Oliver Lodge started something in his investigation of life after death," said Mr. Watson, "and he is going to continue until the world realizes conclusively that materialism is a farce, and that life after death is a reality which can be tested and proved by scientific methods. Fear of death vanishes when one realizes absolute truth. The fear of death and life beyond the grave." There will be another lecture to-night by Mr. Watson on "Man, the Master of His Destiny."

PATROLMAN'S FUNERAL TODAY.—All policemen not on duty have been urged by Chief of Police to attend the funeral of Ben Branch, veteran patrolman, which will be held from Finley's undertaking chapel at 2:30 o'clock this afternoon. Final services will be held at the Portland crematorium. "It is my earnest request that all policemen who can possibly attend to be present to pay our last respects to the grand old man of the police department," the chief said in general orders. The Grand Army of the Republic and Woodmen of the World will take part in the services. The pallbearers will include veteran police and veterans.

CHINESE GAMBLING DEN RAIDED.—Miss Choy So, winsome Chinese miss, was caught busily dealing "blackjack" to white patrons when the police morals squad under Sergeant Keegan raided an alleged Chinese gambling game at 273 1/2 Taylor street. A Chinese lottery also was in full operation, the police reported, and several were marking their tickets when the police arrived. The raid was entirely unexpected as the place was far removed from the Chinese section where gambling flourishes. Frank So and Chin Suey were taken into custody along with conducting a gambling game. They will appear today before Judge Rossman in police court.

FIRE STATION HAS FIRE.—Fire which started from a defective fuse caused damage of about \$1000 to the engine No. 1 fire station, Third and Yamhill streets yesterday afternoon. The blaze started on the roof of the building and spread quickly to the third floor, which was almost entirely destroyed. Chief Holden and Captain Roberts made an investigation and said that sparks from the fuse had caught in a small quantity of sawdust on the roof of the building.

GAME BOARD TO INSPECT

Members of State Commission Leave for State Fair.

State Game Warden Burghdoff and members of the game commission left yesterday for a two weeks' trip through the eastern and southern parts of the state, inspecting fish hatcheries and studying conditions in the various communities relative to the enforcement of the game laws. Game Commissioner Hallock will join the party at Bend this morning. The party is to spend part of today, and from there the trip will be made to the various communities. Two armed and unmasked automobile bandits early yesterday morning held up and robbed W. R. Hartman, night attendant at the Boulevard garage, 1207 Sandy boulevard, and appropriated \$35 from the cash till before making their departure. It was reported to the police detective bureau.

Hartman said he was awakened at about 2:30 o'clock in the morning by one of the bandits, who said he wanted to store his machine for the night. When Hartman arose to open the door, he saw the fellow shoved a gun in his face and kept him covered while a confederate ran into the office and rifled the till. Long Tack himself is the pivot of the performance and everything in it revolves about the entertaining oriental. His personality is markedly a big part of the act and on a little maid in the troupe of wonder workers is a feminine duplicate of him in point of charm and activity and good humor. She is an Americanized Chinese maid, graceful and vivacious, and her sparkling eyes are all absorbing.

She, like Long Tack, takes part in all that goes on, and while the others are leaping and whirling and madly bounding through rymantic adventure, the clever young girl is dancing, or singing, or both.

The wonder workers are a half dozen in number and perform amazing and sensational feats. Long Tack dips into legerdemain and magic with comedy trimmings, and also goes through diverting adventures in balancing and acrobatics. The hangings and drapes of the hall are all Chinese embroideries in beautiful colors and materials, and the Americanized Chinese girl is the most gorgeous in color and embellishment.

Chuck Haas makes a dent in the affections of his audience. He is a cowboy comedy from California and spins conversation the while he spins his ropes. He ties knots in the ropes and in the ribs of his audience with the sheer good nature of his funning. Chuck chuckles and care and is a real refreshing chap.

Sidney Stein and Billy Smith have a highly diverting act in which Sid sings and talks with Billy, who plays the piano. One of the best moments in the act is when Billy gives a page from the life of a girl pianist at a motion picture show. His shifting of tempo and theme and expression of the imaginary reel reels along and puts a personal equation in his comedy. Both men are smart appearing and like to tell you.

Tim Whelan and Priscilla King are an unusually amusing and interesting farce sketch called "Suite 101." The idea is unique, centering around a bath room connecting two hotel rooms, one of which is occupied by a cutie girl (Miss King) and the other by the busy Mr. Whelan. The lines sparkle and both players are admirably fitted for the part.

Chad and Monte Huber are graceful dancers who engage in a series of smart and clever steps, imitating famous dancers and offering original ideas as well.

Opening the bill are Frawley and West, a pair of athletic acrobats who add a teeth-whirling and suspension novelty for good measure.

BIG ELKS' SHOW COMING

MINSTRELS FROM MINNEAPOLIS TO APPEAR HERE.

Special Attraction Will Be Glee Club, Orpheum Entertainers and Monster Parade.

The Minneapolis Elks' all-star minstrel show, which will appear in Portland tomorrow afternoon and evening at the auditorium, is playing to packed houses along the route from Minneapolis to Los Angeles, where the show will be presented four times before the convention which convenes July 10.

The glee club, composed of 25 male singers, which ranks second to no organization of its kind, is with the show and reports is a whole show in itself. There are 80 performers in the minstrels, including two Orpheum entertainers—Willard, "the man who grows," for many seasons a headliner on Orpheum time, and Freddie Wells, an eccentric dancer who is as clever as any dancer on the boards.

A 20-piece symphony orchestra is carried with the troupe and these musicians double in brass for street parades in the various cities visited along the route.

Three shows were given in Minneapolis before the travelers departed for the west and every seat was sold before the time for the curtain to go up. At Aberdeen, S. D., where three shows were staged, packed houses greeted the players. The Capital theater in Yakima, where the Elks will show in that town, seats more than 4000 persons and as early as last Thursday seats were being sold in the 16th row. Aberdeen, Wash., reports a sell-out and Portland Elks are expecting a record-breaking audience to greet the players.

Every penny of the money taken in by the Minneapolis Elks is to be given to the Boy Scouts of their city. The Elks having agreed to contribute \$25,000 in the next three years to do with as the Scout authorities wish.

The show will arrive early tomorrow morning and at noon a monster street parade will be held, in which the local lodge will take part.
